Have you been to our museum lately? If not, you may notice that things aren't exactly like they used to be when you do visit. New displays, new ways of keeping track of our artifacts, and recent renovations have all brought exciting changes to our little museum.

Shall we start on the outside? Both flower gardens in the front of the church and the Pauline Satterfield Annex received new plants and mulch. Thank you very much Calvary Wesleyan Church for the muscle power to help us complete the project. In addition to spreading mulch they planted over 100 tulip bulbs that will surely be beautiful for many springs to come. In addition to the gardens, the exterior lighting has been updated with dusk to dawn sensors to enhance the look of the museum at night and also security. Speaking of the look of the museum at night, has anyone noticed anything else? The Rose window in the church has been illuminated from the inside at night and the Harrington Motors sign on the rear of the building has also been re-illuminated! Take a drive by in the evening to check

it out. Something else to check out are the new windows in the Caboose. The windows were rotten and in need of replacement which was carried out very expertly by Ken Stockslager & Sons. Also the annex building was power washed free of charge by JP of Creative Block & Stone. He did a wonderful job and the building is sparkling clean now.

On the inside there are new displays in both the church and the annex. Due to new artifacts being donated, displays were rearranged to provide better flow and more display space. This was done to improve the visitors experience at our museum. Other enhancements to the guest experience include free guest Wifi and an interactive inventory program. This program allows us to track artifacts and will allow guests to search for items of interest during their visit. It also brought the museum into compliance with The Abandoned Cultural Property Act recently passed by the state legislature.
