





We believe those years and that material were not wasted and that we have enriched literature by our efforts. For years a war-weary people and a graft-ridden world have cried despairingly "What is wrong with the world?" Our most profound philosophers have pondered this question but have not been able to answer it. Our poem does answer the question, although it offers no solution. Counting the apostrophe in Strick's poem as a letter, our poem contains the same number of letters, and the title of the poem is "What Is Wrong With The Cock-Eyed World?" The poem:
