'EARN-MONEY-AT-HOME' SCHEMES

George Reynolds, manager of the chamber of commerce, has issued a warning about schemes and rackets designed to fleece persons who want to earn extra money at home.

The chamber executive stated that promoters of "work at home" schemes make frequent use of classified advertising columns of newspapers.

Scores of different types of earn-money-at-home schemes are currently active, Reynolds states that some of them involve the sale of such varied merchandise as name plates, aprons, jewelry, assembly kits, bird cages, beach robes, lamp shades and even rubber roses.

Despite their diversity, one common denominator can be found in "homework" rackets. Persons responding to the rackets are required to buy something from the promoter.

Persons who make such remittances receive information regarding the promoter's scheme. Experience indicates that little or no money can be made from the schemes of such promoters and in many cases the homemaker may actually lose on the entire deal.

Reynolds urges residents of Okeechobee to request information from the chamber of commerce before responding to advertisements offering spare time work at home.

Poultry Culling Profitable

Culling poultry is a profitable practice—for several reasons, says George Vapaa, county agricultural agent.

First, culling reduces feed costs—it takes 25 to 30 cents a month to feed a hen. Culling also reduces mortality and gives more room to good layers so they'll lay better.

He suggests five ways of catching birds when culling. A catching hook or net can be used, or the job can be done at night with a flashlight.
