Dr. Schuck said that a membership card in the "Women's Reserve of the Boy Scouts of America" will be issued to any women who qualifies by being at least twenty-one years of age and an American citizen or has declared that she will become an American citizen. She will make application in the same manner as local council Scouters. She will be registered only on a local council basis.

These women may serve as faculty members of Cub Scout training courses, assisting in organizing and training in connection with Cub Scout packs and assisting in finance and public relations campaigns. They will serve as members of mothers clubs, parents clubs, and auxiliaries of Scout units. They may serve as merit badges counselors when men cannot be found.

"When the long-distance code is dialed, an impulse is directed to an operator's headset. She then will ask for the number making the call, and key-pulse it into the automatic recording equipment. After that is done, she can no longer cut in on the call.

"The call is directed to the direct distance dialing equipment by the special code 112 and to the New York area by the three-figure area code 212 and to the particular telephone in New York by the letters and figures dialed."

Rose explained that Porter telephone customers with individual and two-party service will not have to dial the special code 112 in order to be connected to the direct distance dialing equipment.

"If someone were dialing a long distance call direct from a Porter telephone to PLaza 5-9970 in New York, he would dial only the area code figures 212, then dial the letters P and L, then the figures 5, 9, 9, 7, and 0," Rose said.

Chincoteague open said that it learned that every activity being conducted there would be moved to other air stations. It asked: "How will this save any money?"

The report noted that civilian wages in the area are 40 cents per hour under others.

The group's report declared that the continuous growth of the air station in the past 18 years produced community growth in all fields. Many facilities such as schools and churches would no longer be needed.

the air station's growth. Nearby Areas Affected At Pocomoke City, Md., about 20 miles to the north, Henry Walter, an attorney, said 130 rental units would become vacant. In an FHA housing development of 53 units, he added, 60 per cent would become vacant. And, Mayor Jeremiah Valliant, of Salisbury, Md., 50 miles away, estimated that close to \$5,000,000 in checks issued to Navy and civilian personnel were cashed in his city. He said merchants estimate they will lose about \$680,000 annually if it closes. The Chincoteague naval payroll is estimated at \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000 annually.
