Corn, Soybeans, Farm and Home Week Topics

Corn took a beating from blight, corn borers, stalk rot and the weather in Kent County last fall, reports county agricultural agent George Vapaa.

Because of last year's experiences with field losses and high moisture problems, corn was made a major topic on the Farm and Home Week program at the University of Delaware.

Dr. R. G. Rothgeb, University of Maryland, will report on the advantages, problems, and methods of growing earlier maturing corn. He will discuss the use of short season hybrids, early planting, and cultural practices.
