Man Shot At Canterbury

Norman Hutson, age 60, was dead on arrival, from shotgun wounds at 5:20 p.m. Tuesday, at Kent General Hospital, Dover

According to State Police at Troop 3, Hutson of Dover was visiting June C. Steele, 40, at her mobile home at the Flying Dutchman Trailer Park. An argument ensued and Hutson allegedly began beating Steele with his fists. She allegedly went to her bedroom and shot him in the chest when he entered her bedroom.

Steele was charged with 2nd degree murder and released on \$25,000 bail for a hearing at a later date.



Police said the men allegedly climbed a fence at Shorgood Poultry Co. on Rehoboth Boulevard, took two crates of chicken parts from a loading platform and placed them in the trunk of Argo's car.

Both pleaded guilty at Aldermans Court and each was fined \$50 plus costs and given a 15-day suspended sentence. They paid the fines and were released.

Arrested After Tavern Fight

Two men were arrested last Friday night after they allegedly became involved in a fight at the Double D Tavern in Georgetown.

Douglas Cannon, 21, of Milton and Owen Bell, 18, of Harrington were charged with disorderly conduct after State Police broke up the fight, which started about 11:30 p.m. in the tavern and moved into the parking lot.

Both were arraigned at Magistrate Court 3 and committed to Sussex County Correctional Institution in default of \$50 bond each, pending trial in the Court of Common Pleas.







In a recent newspaper editorial, CONGRESSMAN PIERRE (PETE) S. DuPONT, IV., was criticized for his alleged role in "filibustering" against the Federal Minimum Wage Law on the floor of the U.S. House of Representatives

Now...on the surface this might appear as though Congressman DuPont is totally against labor, for he did in fact vote against the Minimum Wage Bill.

Frankly speaking if I had the power of the vote, I too would have voted against the Minimum Wage Bill, because of the gross inequities in the law. To my way of thinking there were several areas in the original bill that were gross miscarriages of the law, but some of the more important ones were as follows: allowing large chain stores the protection of the minimum wage bill in that they are not required to pay minimum wage. They are exempt and can pay far less whereas smaller businesses are required to pay the minimum wage as required under the Bill. Smaller businesses naturally gross far less in overall sales, nevertheless they must pay minimum wage. This is bad, for it does not, it seems to me, give equal protection under the law which our Constitution provides.

Another point is the fact that the Federal Government through this Bill was "dictating" to State and Local Governments what rates should be charged. Congressman DuPont is against further Federal Government interference.

In other areas, the Bill called for minimum wage (mandatory) for part-time summer help. This would apply in cases where students would be employed on summer jobs. There is nothing wrong with this, particularly if the student has no experience. Why should a businessman be required to pay the minimum if the employe has no prior experience? It costs today to train someone, and if you don't believe it look at the record.

Finally, there is no such thing as a filibuster in the U.S. House of Representatives. The House rules prohibit this process and permits a speaker no mcre than FIVE (5) MINUTES as a MAXIMUM -- and there is where Congressman takes the MINIMUM. It never has taken him more than FIVE(5) MINUTES to say what he has to say





much criticism in recent months. Because the condition of a city street had reached nearly an inoperative state due to heavy truck traffic, the city fathers were beseiged by irate citizens who lived on that street.

The situation has both good and bad points of consideration. The positive aspect is that people became involved in the operation of their city government by attending meetings and making their views known. The negative side is that, as is often the case, the involvement came after conditions had reached a deplorable state and it seemed to take a barrage of criticism before the situation was rectified

There will be times when the actions of City Council will be criticised. That is not the point here nor is it criticism of one segment of the community. The issue here is involvement. As someone recently remarked, America is a band aid society. We try to patch up, instead of getting involved with problems and correcting them. The result is a continuation of patching up, not correcting and curing.

Every time the Council meets and makes a decision, it affects each citizen directly or otherwise. What sort of interest is there in a city government whose officials are appointed because no one in a ward will stand for election, or where a seat comes up for election and no opposition arises?

Criticism cannot lie at the doorstep of the Council, rather at the private residences here. If we fail to show interest, what can we expect? If council seats have to be filled by asking citizens to fill them, how can we be critical of the actions taken by people who are interested enough to sit on the Council

The governing body here will only be as strong as the citizenry wishes it to be, only as effective as the population becomes involved at the ground level, not only when conditions become deplorable.

There is a smooth passable street now, where a few months ago there was a street resembling a mine field. Involvement by the people who lived there, going to the council meetings, calling their representative, presenting a united front helped correct the condition of the street. Let the rest of the City learn from the actions of the citizens on that street. Get involved, stay involved and conditions won't have to become critical, whatever they might be.

Show interest in the city government and see an interested city government. They can't and don't want to do the job alone
