Levy Court To Charge Towns For Information

What price for service? was the question at the Tuesday, February 21 Levy Court meeting. The answer turned out to be \$50 an hour.

According to William P. Moran, secretary to the Board of Assessment, Kent County is now in a position to offer municipalities and towns in Kent County computer print-outs.

Moran informed the commissioners that school districts paid \$50 per hour for the computer print-outs. Moran, however, recommended that the county perform this service for free, for towns and municipalities, the first year and ask for feed-back or corrections on the material.

The commissioner's, however, felt that this would be a digression from their long standing policy of charging towns and municipalities for services.

Consequently, towns and municipalities will be treated the same way the school districts are. They will pay \$50 an hour for computer print-out time.

These computer print-outs contain information such as name, location, assessed value, deed information, and a description of improvements for property included in the tax mapping project. Moran said that towns could use the information to help set tax rates.

According to Moran, only two towns have requested computer print-outs, the City of Harrington and the City of Dover.

Moran said that a computer print-out for a town the size of Harrington would probably take less than an hour. He had no idea of the time involved for a town the size of Dover.


Moran indicated that towns and municipalities do have an alternative to paying the \$50 an hour charge. The assessment books are open, he said, and in the past he indicated that towns have sent up employees who have copied the information by hand.

In other business, the commissioners approved two resolutions to finance the Dykes Branch sewer project. The \$1,536,500 system will serve about 700 residents in a 470 acre area bordered by Kent 100, Kent 156, and the Cheswold Sanitary District.

Walter L. Fritz, county engineer, said he thought construction on the project could begin by summer.

Proposed bids for construction of a sewer for the Allen Frear Elementary School and the John S. Charlton School at Rising Sun were referred to the county engineer's office for study and evaluation.

Levy Court accepted a federal check from Donald Perkuchin. This money will be used to reimburse two Kent County School Districts for the untaxed federal lands in their districts. This money comes from the land at Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge near Leipsic.

Police Investigate Murder, Chipman School Burglary

Homicide and attempted suicide along with burglary kept both the Delaware State Police and the Harrington Police Department busy in two separate incidents last week.

On Friday the victim of an apparent homicide was Loretta Benson, 38, of 101 West Street, who was dead on arrival at the Nanticoke Memorial Hospital in Seaford after she had apparently been shot in the head with a .22 caliber rifle by her common law husband, Herbert Flamer.

Flamer, 55, of 127 Millipion Street in Harrington is in serious condition in the Delaware Division of the Wilmington Medical Center after apparently attempting to commit suicide, after shooting Miss Benson by shooting himself in the forehead. Flamer had been scheduled to appear in magistrate court in Harrington on Friday morning but instead allegedly went to the home of Miss Benson about 10 a.m. and forced her at gunpoint to get into a car and drive to a deserted road 1 1/2 miles north of Harrington off of County Road 275.

After arriving there Flamer apparently shot Miss Benson and then shot himself. Her body and the wounded Flamer were found by a truck driver who was using the road as access to his place of business (Mutual Rendering) around 2:20 p.m. Friday afternoon. He then contacted the Delaware State Police who upon arrival contacted the Harrington Volunteer Fire Department Ambulance who transported the injured Flamer to the Milford Memorial Hospital. Flamer was then transferred to the Delaware Division by the Delaware State Police Helicopter.

Flamer had been arrested three times during the past month for trespassing around the Benson residence and several arguments between the couple had been reported to the police since they split up their seventeen year relationship sometime in January.

Flamer had a previous history of suicidal attempts as on February 13th he tried to hang himself when Chief Edward Layton of the Harrington Police Department attempted to serve warrants on him. Layton had Flamer committed to the Beebe Hospital in

Lewes but after the 72 hour observation period ended Flamer was released.

Earlier in the week the Harrington Police Department had received the report from the W.T. Chipman school that unknown subjects had entered the building through a window at the back of the building by apparently prying it open with a pair of pliers and a screwdriver. After the subjects gained entrance to the building they went to the junior high school office and then to the cafeteria where they made off with

approximately eighty-two dollars in currency. The investigation is continuing.

Also on the 21st of February the Police received a report after a wrestling match at the W.T. Chipman school that a wallet belonging to Edwin Meredith was reported stolen from the gym office. The wallet had been removed from the pants pocket.

On the 22nd of February police received a report from the Salvation Army Store that two small juveniles had shoplifted two pullover shirts.

Students Join In MS Read-A-Thon Program

HARRINGTON -- W.T. Chipman students will join over 70 other private and public schools in Delaware in reading books to help fight Multiple Sclerosis. The program began with an assembly Monday morning and will continue through March 31.

The MS Read-A-Thon is a nationwide reading program for children ages 6 to 14. While reading books for pleasure, the young people ask for donations from friends and relatives for each book they read. The money goes for MS research and patient services, such as home care and transportation to the hospital or clinic.

According to Mary Lou

Berry, spokesperson for the Delaware chapter, Read-A-Thon was originated and developed by the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, and is supervised by local MS chapters in conjunction with local schools. It has the support of the U.S. Office of Education and the International Reading Association, who "consider the program to have unusual educational and social value."

The young people who register are called "Mystery Sleuths", as they are involved in "the search to solve the mystery of MS."

Last year, 12,124 Delaware students registered to read for the four-week period. At Lake

Forest North in Felton, 648 books were read and \$837 was raised for MS, according to Marjorie S. Williams, librarian at the school.

Mountains of trash like this would make some people cringe. But Bill Duerr and Bob Shaw, owners of Reclamations Center, Inc. love a sight like this. Trash, or, the recycling of trash, is their business.

At Reclamations Center

They Love Your Trash

 What do Oscar the Trash Can Grouch, Bill Shaw, and Bill Duerr have in common?
 They all love trash.
 Oscar the Trash Can Grouch lives in a trash can. He loves trash so much that viewers of Sesame Street often hear him proclaim: "Oh I love trash!" Bill Shaw and Bill Duerr own and operate the Reclamation Center near Little Creek.
 Duerr has been in the trash business for a long time. Prior to opening the reclamation center, Duerr owned All-Rite Rubbish Removal. "I found I was throwing more and more stuff into the landfills," explained Duerr.
 In 1972 Duerr began to do studies on trash reclamation under a grant from the Division of Economic Development in Delaware. Duerr said that "there is not a thing going into the landfill today that can't be recycled."
 Shaw explained that aluminum can be recycled into more aluminum. Aluminum is used in everything from beverage cans to TV dinner trays. Shaw cautioned, however, that

some cans have aluminum tops, bi-metal bodies, and steel bottoms. These cans cannot be recycled as aluminum.
 Other fuels that may be made through resource recovery are fire place logs. That old chair you dump in a landfill could be recycled to produce fire place logs. One log made from recycled wood can burn for 3 1/2 hours and put off 8,500 BTUs.
 Solid waste is one thing, but, what about wet garbage? Duerr and Shaw claim that anything can be recycled. To prove their point they took a full jar of mayonaisse, removed the lid, and placed it in their "ecology box." Shaw said they forgot about the jar for about three weeks. "When we went to check it the label was gone and the jar was as clean as if you had washed it," Shaw said.
 The "ecology box" is a wooden, bottom-less box which is placed above an eighteen inch hole. A small amount of leaf mulch may be added. Earth worms are what make the box work. The earth worms can decompose one ton of wet trash within 45 to 50 days. What re-

mains is a rich mulch which can be used on house plants or gardens.
 Recently, Shaw has suggested that town councils use total resource recovery as a means to alleviate their trash problems. Shaw said that a town like Houston has a \$3,000 trash bill each year. He said that towns pay to have the trash hauled away and they pay to have it put in a dump. "Reclamation would eliminate operational costs and pay the towns for their products," Shaw said.
 Shaw indicated that towns might have some problems with recycling solid waste. He mentioned that there would have to be a way to separate the materials. In addition, towns would have to find places to store the trash until it could be taken to a reclamation center.
 "Reclamation is an idea whose time is here," Shaw said. "Communities have never had a place to send their trash before, other than the landfill," he continued. Shaw indicated that reclamation may be a viable alternative for towns battling trash woes.

tened over into the other lane.
 The truck was equipped with a snow blade because the road conditions were described as "ice and snow."
 Mrs. Irene Hayes, the driver of the bus, saw the truck and tapped her brakes. The bus slid forward and to the right up a slight embankment. The rear of the bus slid around going into a ditch and tipping over onto its side against the embankment.
 Mr. Stoops, the school bus coordinator at Lake Forest, told the school board that he checked with 4 students on the bus. He said 2 thought or said that she could have been going slow and 2 thought that she could have been going a little slower.
 Mrs. Hayes did not know what speed she was going. She was found guilty of careless driving. Mr. Stoops, explained however, that "after the accident we had her go to the motor vehicle lanes and take another road

test; she passed."
 Of the 27 students on the bus, 9 were injured with slight cuts and scratches. These 9 were treated and released. Later that same day, however, Mr. Jenkins claims that 5 more students were treated for injuries sustained in the bus accident. Jenkins' daughter was among these 5.
 Jenkins brought a question to the school board on February 13, 1978. "Why," he asked, "weren't all students checked?" and "Why," he continued, "is there no set policy for school bus accidents?"
 Mr. Stoops said, on February 27, 1978, that the Lake Forest School Board is working on a policy. He mentioned, however, that even if there is a policy people get shook up and forget about procedures and policy.
 Investigation has shown that only one of three area schools has a bus accident policy. According to Don Blakey at Caesar Rodney, "as far as taking children

to the hospital, we would leave it up to the ambulance attendants." Blakey feels that some policy is needed.
 Milford School District does have a policy. However, according to Mr. Pizzadilli, "we have never had to use it, thank God." The Milford policy, though written out, is not very clear, Pizzadilli admits.
 Mr. Kenneth Luke, a spokesperson for Milford Hospital, stated that if all 27 children would have been brought in with only 9 injured, "a chaotic situation" would have ensued. Luke, however, said that if an accident were bad enough the Hospital does have a disaster plan. This plan calls in all available physicians and nurses. Luke explained that the emergency room has one physician in attendance at all times.
 He said that the charge for checking all students from a bus accident would be much greater than the cost of a family physician checking the child.



Go-Karts Displayed At Blue Hen Mall

The Blue Hen Mall hosted an exhibit of Go Karts February 23rd through 25th.
You don't see too many hula hoops or contests for eating goldfish anymore -- but one fabulous fad of the fifties has matured into a solid family sport. Go-Karting has become so popular that every Memorial Day the City of

Milford closes off its streets to all vehicles except go-karts. The go-karts race through the streets of Milford.
Besides the Memorial Day race there are races held just about every Sunday from May to November. In this area there are two paved tracks; a paved asphalt road course in Chester-

town, Maryland and a paved oval in Milford.
Go-Karting is something just about anyone can do. Men, women, boys, and girls between the ages of 6 and 70 race go-karts in this area. In fact, Mrs. Janice Bowman, whose son is an avid go-karter, claims "there is a 70 year old man who races go-karts in Milford."

According to Tom Moore, of the Kent Kart Club, the Go-Karts are pretty safe. Races are divided by classes which are determined by age and weight limits.

The Go-Karts have a single engine. They have a top speed of about 100 miles per hour. However, they usually race between 50 and 60 miles per hour because they are usually racing on an oval track.

The price for getting a start in Go-Karting range \$250 for a used model to \$1,500 for the works. There are two local groups, the Milford Kart Club and the Kent Kart Club.

Go-Karters do not race for money. They race for trophies or points. Moore, however, explained that Go-Karting can be a stepping stone for other types of racing such as Formula 4's and Grand Nationals. Moore said that Harold Bunting and Haines Taw who now race out of Georgetown got their start in Go-Karting.

"If you get your skills down with a go-kart you can handle anything," Moore said. "These are quick little machines," he continued.

Allison Now Fifth

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. -- Bobby Allison's victory in Sunday's Daytona 500 boosted him from 29th place into fifth in NASCAR's Winston Cup Grand National point standings and within sight of the defending champion and current point leader, Cale Yarborough.

Allison, whose last Winston Cup win came in the 1975 Southern 500, put the Norris Industries Ford Thunderbird into Daytona's victory circle and now trails Yarborough by 107 points in the chase for the '78 title.

case in all Winston Cup events.

The top-finishing rookie in Sunday's race was Roger Hamby, who piloted his Burger King Chevrolet to a 15th place finish and picked up the \$500 prize offered the top rookie in each Winston Cup race among those challenging for 1978 First National City Travelers Checks Rookie-of-the-Year honors.

Yarborough continues to lead the Winston Cup point list with 360 points, followed by Benny Parsons with 345; Dave Marcis, 305; Dick Brooks, 273; Bobby Allison, 253; D.K. Ulrich, 246; Buddy Arrington, 245; Neil Bonnett, 242; Tighe Scott, 239; and David Pearson, 231.

Yarborough also maintained his lead in the money-won list with \$55,750. Following are Allison with \$48,755; Parsons (\$38,350); Brooks (\$21,115); Darrell Waltrip (\$20,230); Ron Hutcherson (\$19,950); Marcis (\$18,250); Richard Petty (\$16,700); Buddy Baker (\$16,395) and Pearson (\$14,775).

Winston Cup action picks up next on Sunday, Feb. 26, with the Richmond 400 at Richmond (Va.) Fairgrounds Raceway, followed the next Sunday, March 5, by the Carolina 500 at Rockingham's North Carolina Motor Speedway.
