## Six cars derail

A minor derailment involving six railroad cars in Harrington last Friday went almost unnoticed, resulted in no damage and caused few problems other than seven hours of waiting and work for Conrail.

Trainmaster, Joe Morris, told the *Journal* this week that the six cars derailed themselves late last Friday afternoon because of a "wide gauge" situation in which tracks on a south siding spread apart, and the cars dropped between the tracks. Morris said a combination of weather and tie conditions caused the tracks to spread.

There were four box cars and two tank cars, all loaded, involved. The tank cars carried corrosive chemicals bound for the DuPont Company. But the chemicals were also non-flammable, and in any event, none of the cars were overturned. Therefore, said Morris, there was never any danger to the public.

The Harrington Volunteer Fire Company was called in to assess the situation and agreed with Conrail's conclusion. First Assistant Chief, Bob Taylor said the fire company "kept an eye on the situation". He also reported that Conrail gave them all particulars and that the railroad company and the fire organization are striving to maintain a good working relationship. Taylor said trainmaster Joe Morris is himself involved in a volunteer fire company and is or has been a chief in the Delmar Company.

Morris told the *Journal* it took seven hours to repair the track and to lift the cars via crane back on the rails. But four hours of that time was spent waiting for the cranes. He said everything was back in order early Saturday morning, and there were no rail traffic tie ups resulting from the incident.

## Deputy jury almost complete

Jury selection in the trial of Andre Deputy, accused of the February 1979 murders of Alberta and Byard Smith of Harrington should be complete this week. The process started on Wednesday last week when Deputy was taken to Beebe Hospital for treatment of swelling in his leg. On Thursday, winter weather caused cancellation of proceedings in Superior Court where Judge William G. Bush III is conducting the trial proceedings.

Jury selection, with two jurors and four alternates still to be chosen, was to continue yesterday. Last Tuesday, fourteen possible jurors were questioned before attorneys

for the two sides were able to agree on the first one. The first selection came at 3:45 p.m., and four more were chosen before the court adjourned at 4:30. By the time Judge Bush recessed Wednesday's proceedings, five men and five women had been tapped to serve.

Attorney for the defense, Dean C. Johnson made an attempt last week to have evidence obtained from Deputy at the time of his arrest suppressed, because he said Deputy was held for five minutes longer than the two-hour detention period allowed by law. That

In order to strengthen this effort to accentuate the positive, the students honored as Student of the Month will receive a certificate. In addition, letters announcing their selection will go to their parents.

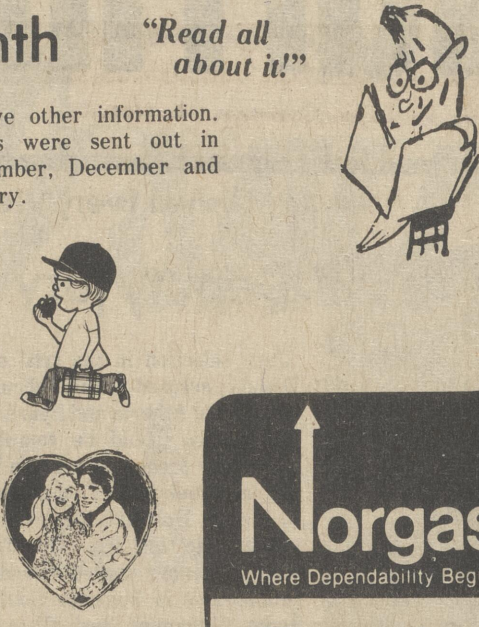
