Committee to tackle Conrail problems

A newly formed committee from the Harrington Chamber of Commerce will tackle the problems the community is experiencing with blocked railroad crossings as well as other complaints with Conrail operations here. Ways of putting pressure on Conrail to take those problems more seriously will be considered.

Formation of the committee whose three-member nucleus is comprised of Frank Chick, Bob Taylor and Ray Gagne, was an outgrowth of an informal discussion held at the Chamber's February meeting last week.

Frank Chick said the traffic tie-ups may discourage people from shopping in Harrington.

A more serious matter, that of public safety, according to Bob Taylor is an issue which concerns the Harrington Volunteer Fire Company.

The fire company has worried that emergency vehicles might be stopped in situations in which time is crucial.

The railroad and the fire company have set up a "hot line" so that either

pointed out the erratic crossing situation. He observed a train miss a car "by less than ten feet" with no gate down, and other times, he said. "The gates have been down about an hour and a half." Gagne thought "railroad politics" might be playing a part, with those who oppose the block house closing adding to the growing confusion. The Chamber of Commerce and the Fire Company, he reported, plan to launch protests.

Citizens who ask to speak at the public hearing, said Mayor Al Mann, should emulate Bill Minner and have specifics, including dates and times, written down.

one can be alerted in an emergency. On the night of the fire which destroyed 20,000 chickens belonging to Peggy Gallo when it was necessary to call on the Houston Fire Company for aid, Curtis Melvin reported the "hot line" rang 18 times before anyone at the rail office answered. He also said it rang several times before he started counting. That time there were apparently no trains on the way, and thus no crucial tie-ups. It's what could happen that worries the fire company.

Crossing gates that are lowered and remain closed for periods of time when there is no apparent movement on the rail line is another concern. Frequently, people kept waiting and yielded to the temptation to drive through the crossing gates. It is illegal to do so.

Some ideas tossed about for consideration were inviting a representative from Conrail and Delaware's Congressman Tom Evans to attend a meeting at which local concerns could be stated, sponsoring a citizen petition or even a day of protest.

Kimberly Zeitler Wins Recipe Contest

In spite of ice weather, there was a standing-room only crowd at the consumer program which was the kick off of the recent Delmarva Pork Congress in Salisbury, Md. One of the highlights of the program was announcement of winners in the 1982 Favorite Pork Recipe Contest.

Winner of the youth main dish division was Kimberly Zeitler of Harrington, De., with her "Pork Chops Supreme." Following is Miss Zeitler's winning recipe:

PORK CHOPS SUPREME

8 3/4-inch pork chops
1 tablespoon cooking oil
2 tablespoons brown sugar, packed
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
2 (8 ounce) cans pineapples (sliced)
8 thin orange slices
8 thin lemon slices
8 thin onion slices
8 cherries
2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 tablespoons cornstarch
1 tablespoon water

Brown pork chops in hot oil in 12 inch skillet. Remove as they brown to a shallow roasting pan. Combine brown sugar, cinnamon and cloves; sprinkle

over chops. Drain pineapple, reserving juice. Place 1 pineapple slice, 1 orange slice, 1 lemon slice and 1 onion slice on top of each chop. Combine pineapple and lemon juice; pour juice in pan around chops. Cover pan with foil. Bake in 350 degree oven 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake 45 minutes more.

Harrington Police Chief Carl McIlroy has asked any person who may have seen anyone or noticed any unusual activity around Quillen's between 11 p.m. on Thursday Feb. 4 and 12:50 a.m., Friday, Feb. 5 to contact the police department at 398-4494.

Still unsolved is a robbery on October 13 in which Earl Quillen, owner and operator of the market, was assaulted as he was leaving the store, and bound with an electric cord.

McIlroy said the latest burglary at Quillen's makes a total of five in which fairly large sums have been involved which have occurred in and around Harrington over the last six months.

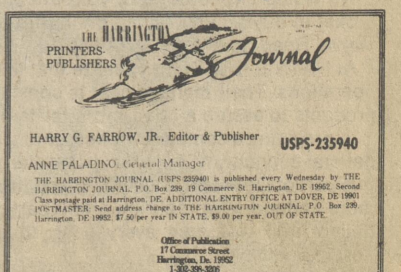

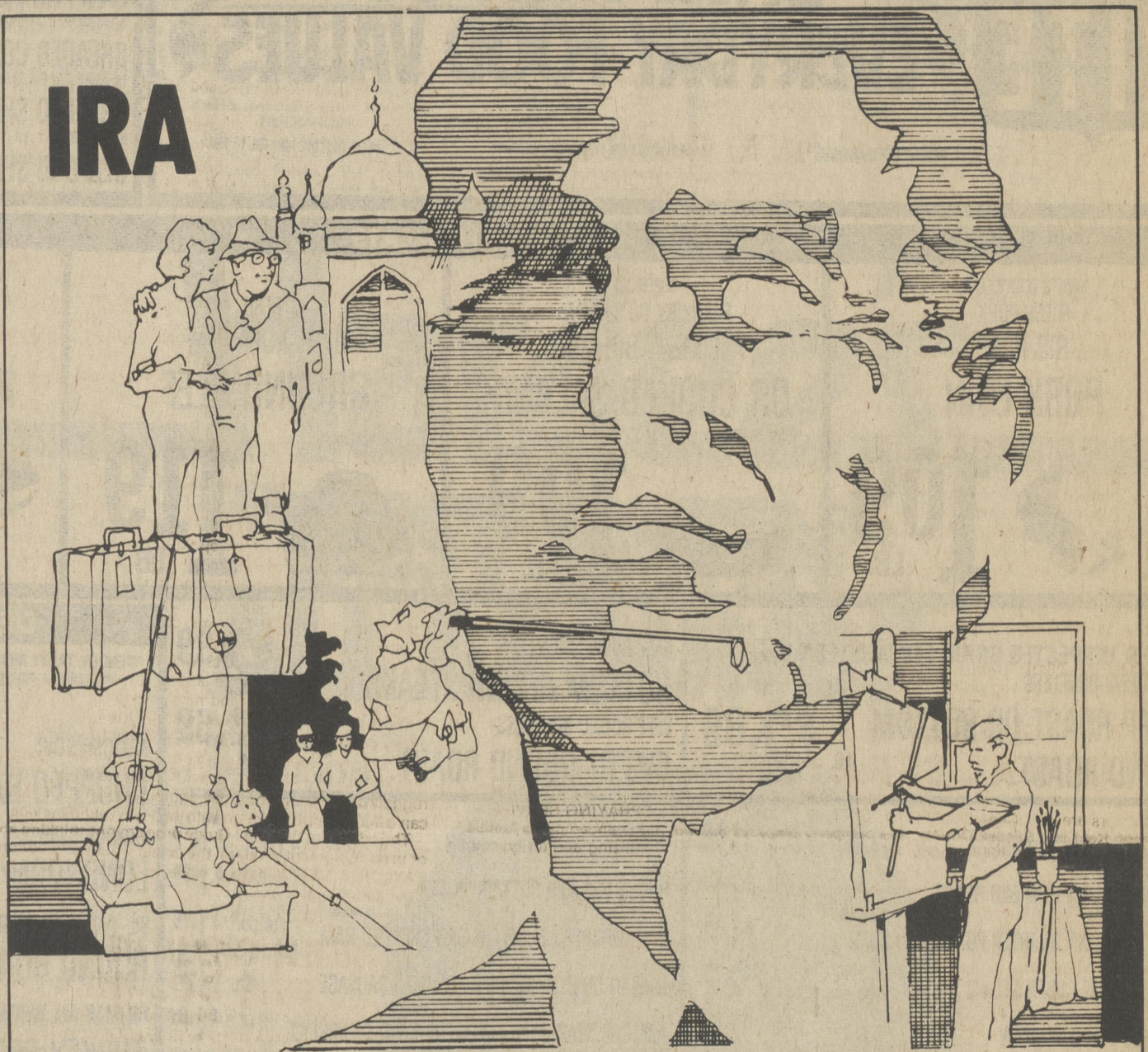

Anne's Kitchen

Good Italian spaghetti sauce does not come in a jar. No fancy ingredients are required, however, good Italian style plum tomatoes are a must. Other kinds simply have too much water content and are not meant for spaghetti sauce. It is not easy to find the type of canned tomatoes you need, but I have had measured success with Acme brand Ideal peeled plum tomatoes. The price is 89 cents per can, (up 10 cents from the last time I bought them) and about the best you can find for the price. Perhaps our own local markets would bring some better brands into our stores if we make a point of asking for them. I'm sure they are eager to fill our needs if they know what those needs are.

Step #5 should not be taken lightly. I always feel it makes the sauce.

SAUCE

3 cans peeled plum tomatoes (approx. 28 oz.)
1 clove garlic
1/4 cup olive oil
4 leaves fresh basil
salt & pepper to taste

1. Heat olive oil in large sauce pot. Add peeled garlic till browned. Remove garlic and discard.
2. Put tomatoes in blender and blend about two seconds. Pour into olive oil and simmer uncovered with basil, salt and pepper till oil forms rings on top of sauce. At this point, you have a plain or Marinara sauce. If you stop here, this sauce can be used with spaghetti.

MEATBALLS

While sauce is cooking, assemble the following:
1 lb. good quality ground beef
1 small clove garlic, minced
Bread or cracker crumbs
2 eggs
1/4 cup grated Italian cheese
1 tablespoon chopped Italian parsley
1/4 cup olive oil
Milk
Salt and pepper to taste

1. In a large bowl, put approx. 3/4 cup bread or cracker crumbs. Add enough milk to form a loose paste and allow to set approx. five minutes. Blend well with a fork.
2. Add all other ingredients except meat and oil, and blend well. Add meat last and mix very well with hands.

Moisten hands with water and shape meat mixture into balls. Set aside.
3. Heat oil in heavy skillet and fry meat balls, turning to brown all sides.
4. Drop into sauce and continue cooking.
5. When all meat balls are fried, put about one cup of sauce into skillet and

loosen any crusty bits left in pan. Add to original sauce pot and continue cooking till sauce has reduced to thickness you prefer. Cooking time should be about 2 1/2-3 hours. Meatballs should be added during the last hour of cooking.

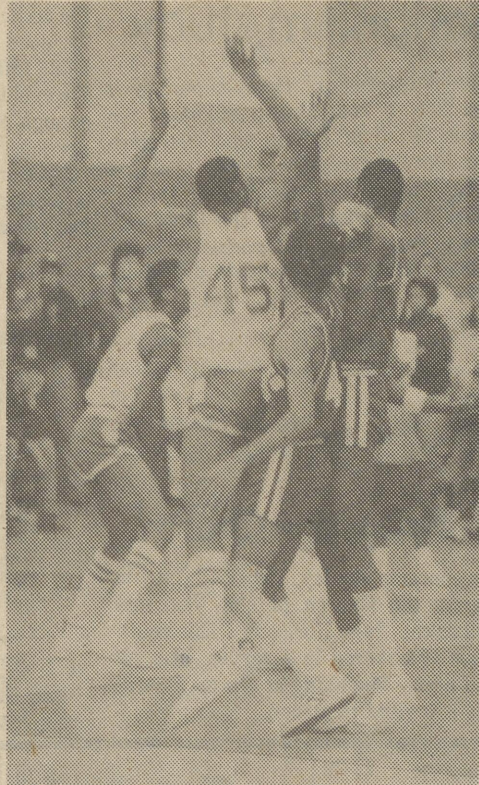

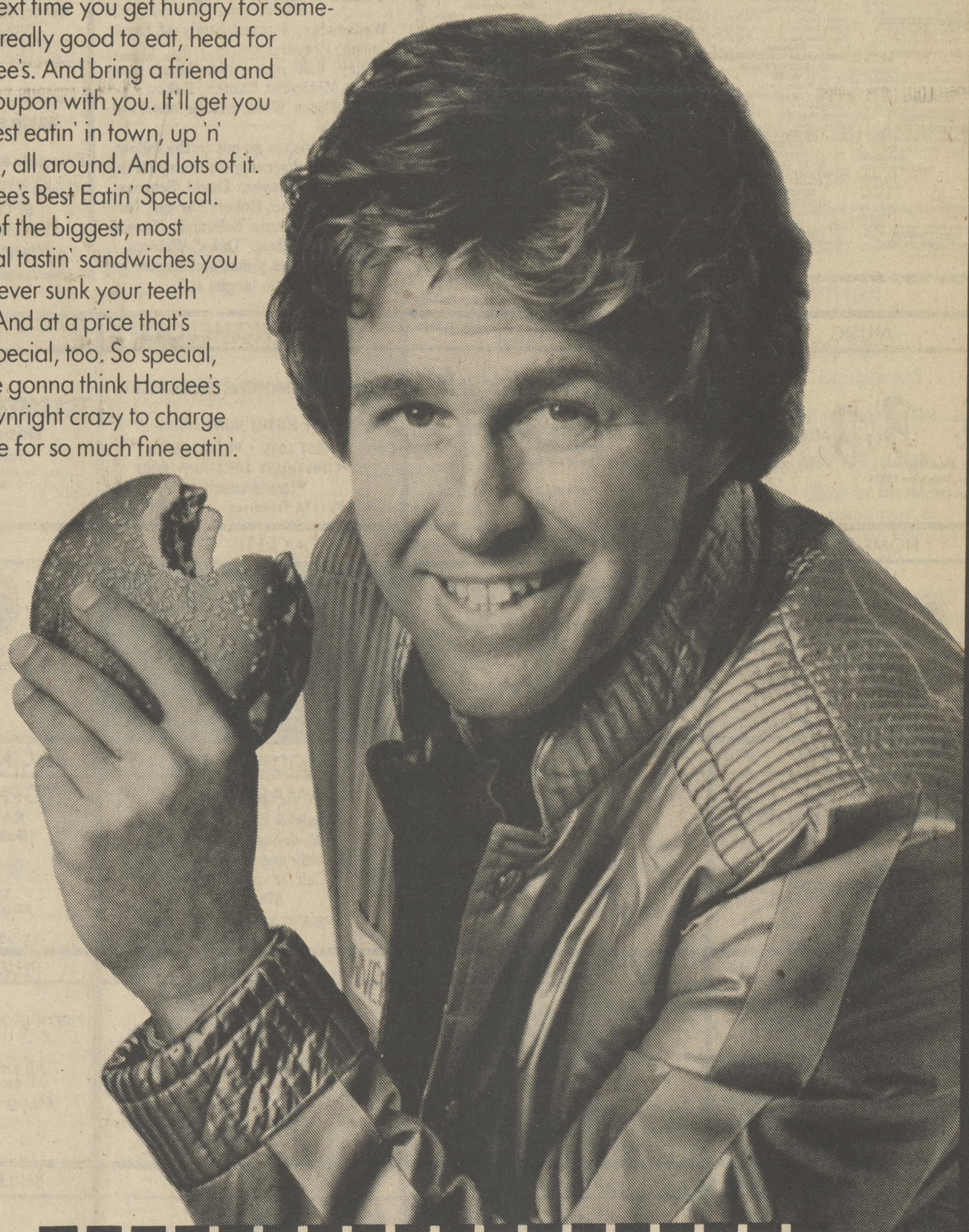
