boundary description drawn up by Milford Architect Charles Murphy to define the boundary between the Lake Forest and the Woodbridge School Districts. The decision should settle a lengthy dispute that has embroiled the two districts in litigation over the past six years.

The Murphy line had been generally acceptable as the Woodbridge School District was concerned. But Lake Forest has been less than happy with the boundary which cut into territory it claims.

According to Deputy Attorney General Roger Aiken, the decision does make som provision for those who ave children in either district whom they want to continue in the schools they

have been attending. Children now in kindergarten

schools until they finish sixth grade. regardless of where the boundary falls. Those who are already in high school may stay and graduate from their present school if thier parents or guardians make that request for them. Those who have not already started school in either district will have to abide by the boundary decision.

There will be no change in this school year, but starting in September, the two districts would have to exchange tuition funds for any students who take advantage of the provisions for allowing those already attending school in one district or the other the choice of remaining there for the specified period.

Lake Forest Assistant Superintendent Melvin Luff said Tuesday morning that the district had not thus far received official word of the decision.

After reviewing bids submitted for the town's trash collection business, the Frederica Council Monday night selected Eastern Disposal, low bidder by a hair over N.L. Wilkins and Son. The two trash collection firms have seesawed in serving Frederica. N.L. Wilkins got the contract in 1981-82, and Eastern Disposal had it in 1980-81. In reviewing the bids, the Frederica Council considered the proposed fees fortrash collection from individual residences plus the charge for a once a month pickup of heavier items. It did not consider the cost of disposal at the state landfill since those charges are fixed by the Delaware Solid Waste Authority and are the same for all contractors. They are to go up from \$12.50 to \$14.50 per ton in July.
