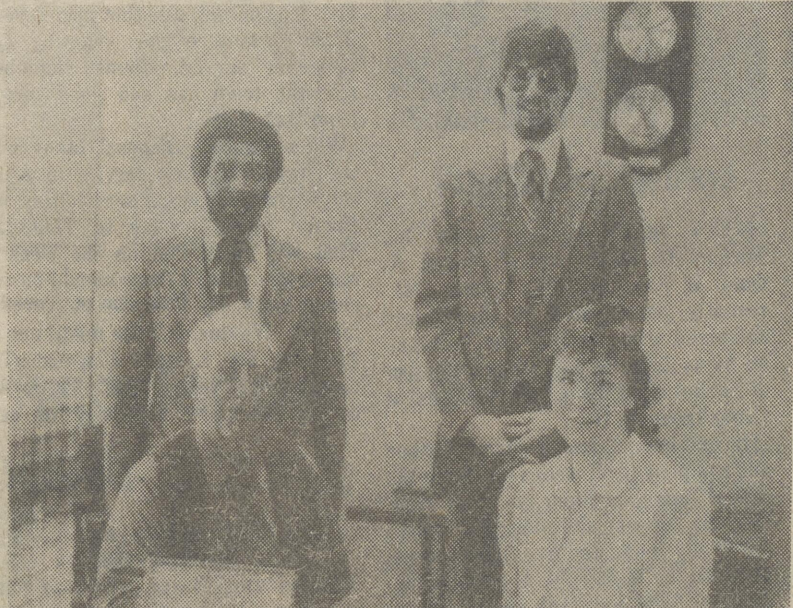
Walton to address Prayer Breakfast

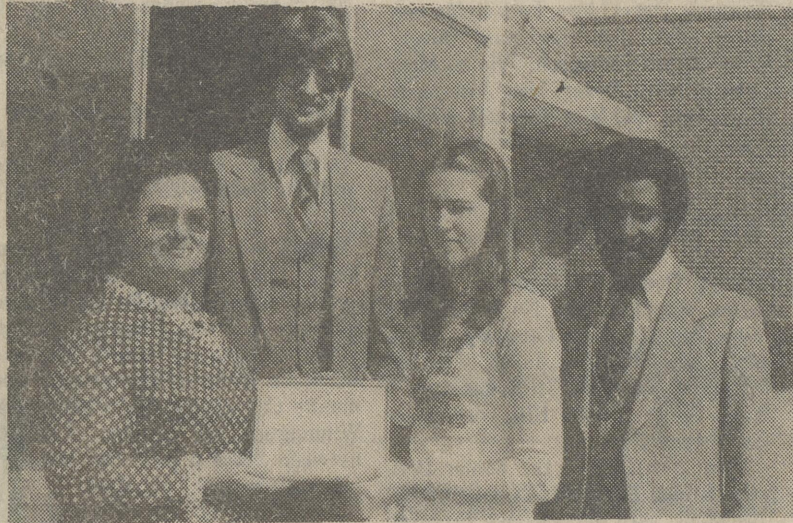
The featured speaker John Walton, who serves as President of the Delaware Farm Bureau, will speak on Agribusiness.

Murphy line will mark boundary

The State Board of Education last week settled on the "Murphy line", the boundary description drawn up by Milford Architect Charles Murphy to define the boundary between the Lake Forest and the Woodbridge School Districts. The decision should settle a lengthy dispute that has embroiled the two districts in litigation over the past six years.

The Murphy line had been generally acceptable as the Woodbridge School District was concerned. But Lake Forest has been less than happy with the boundary which cut into territory it claims.

According to Deputy Attorney General Roger Aiken, the decision does make some provision for those who have children in either district whom they want to continue in the schools they have been attending.

Children now in kindergarten

through sixth grade will have the option of remaining in their present schools until they finish sixth grade, regardless of where the boundary falls. Those who are already in high school may stay and graduate from their present school if their parents or guardians make that request for them. Those who have not already started school in either district will have to abide by the boundary decision.

There will be no change in this school year, but starting in September, the two districts would have to exchange tuition funds for any students who take advantage of the provisions for allowing those already attending school in one district or the other the choice of remaining there for the specified period.

Lake Forest Assistant Superintendent Melvin Luff said Tuesday morning that the district had not thus far received official word of the decision.

Police Beat: Burtons Hit

Burton's Sport Shop in Harrington was the weekend target of burglars who entered through a window and used a hammer to break into various pinball and game machines and the jukebox. The thieves did about \$200 worth of damage to the machines and made off with \$175 in coins. According to the Harrington Police who are still investigating the incident, the break-in occurred sometime between Burtons' closing on Friday, March 19, and the time it opened up on Saturday Morning.

In a similar incident on Saturday, the News Journal vending box was taken from Quillen Shopping Center sometime on Saturday. The value of the box which was later found by HPD in a nearby field was around \$175, and there was \$19 in quarters inside. The box was recovered intact with the money still inside. The incident is being investigated.

The Harrington Police also responded to a report of broken storm windows at the rear of Trinity United Methodist Church. The breakage occurred sometime between March 15 and 16.

A property damage accident on Friday, March 19 involved a pickup truck driven by John C. Coker, Jr. of Felton. Coker was turning from Fleming Street onto Liberty Street in Harrington and failed to negotiate the corner. His vehicle hit a power pole. Coker was charged with inattentive driving.

Louis Welch of Harrington reported the theft of about \$18 worth of gasoline from a car belonging to his daughter, Lori Welch. The theft, also under investigation, happened between March 20 and 21.

Trash contract awarded in Frederica

After reviewing bids submitted for the town's trash collection business, the Frederica Council Monday night selected Eastern Disposal, low bidder by a hair over N.L. Wilkins and Son. The two trash collection firms have seasawed in serving Frederica. N.L. Wilkins got the contract in 1981-82, and Eastern Disposal had it in 1980-81.

In reviewing the bids, the Frederica Council considered the proposed fees for trash collection from individual residences plus the charge for a once a month pickup of heavier items. It did not consider the cost of disposal at the state landfill since those charges are fixed by the Delaware Solid Waste Authority and are the same for all contractors. They are to go up from \$12.50 to \$14.50 per ton in July. Eastern Disposal's total bid was

Milford Ames to reopen after extensive renovation

Shoppers who go to Milford on Saturday, March 25 will find a completely re-modeled Ames Department Store in the Milford Plaza Shopping Center. According to the store management, the new Ames will offer a wider selection than ever of name brands and a visually attractive presentation of merchandise that will offer customers a store that's truly attractive to shop in. Along with the new look, Ames will have acquired will go a staff which has undertaken some intensive training in new products and merchandise presentations.

Ames celebrated its first grand opening in the Milford Plaza Shopping Center nearly 10 years ago, on Thursday, June 29, 1972. On that date several thousand customers braved dark skies and threatening weather to visit the new store. Mr Rynkowski joined Ames in 1976 as an assistant manager in Aberdeen, Md. He served Ames stores in Reisterstown and Edgewood, Md. before being promoted to manager. As manager he served stores in Amenia, New York, and Smyrna, Delaware, before coming to Milford.

Robert McCleary, the District Supervisor for the Milford store, joined Ames in 1973 as an assistant manager of an Ames store in Albion, New York. He was promoted to District Supervisor in August 1980.

Both Rynkowski and McCleary are examples in point of the employee

incentives Ames offers through its policy of bringing personnel "up through the ranks".

When Ames opened its first store in Southbridge, Massachusetts in 1958, it established a tradition of total community involvement. Despite the fact that Ames has grown from one store to a chain of 132, it maintains an active interest in each community where it is a member.
