## New assessmentlowerstax rate 78\%

| The new assessed amount is in for the Town of Harrington. It is a record a whopping $\$ 29,402,246.00$ as compared to the old amount 12 years ago of $\$ 11,500,000$. At the same time, Coun- cilman Curtis Melvin voted to base the tax rate for the twenty nine million figure at 32 cents per $\$ 100$ which is a record low. The old figure of a year ago was $\$ 1.21$ per $\$ 100$. This is a reduction of the tax rate by $78 \%$ or 89 cents lower. <br> A year ago the tax rate was $\$ 1.00$ per $\$ 100$, and the council voted to raise this created quite a stir in the community; as compared to the new assessment ..and the reduced tax rate will be approximately the same figure, which geted. <br> Mayor Al Mann praised the new assessment and lower tax rate saying attractive to lenders and the low tax rate will be very attractive to new businesses and industry".
