So far there has been no word of the selection of a replacement to fill out Griffith's unexpired Council term.

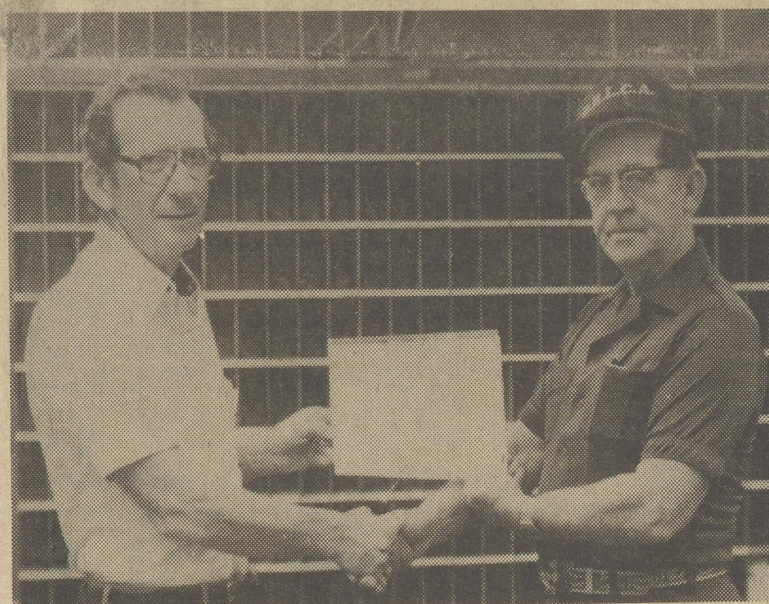
Burrsville Ruritan sponsors blood pressure clinic

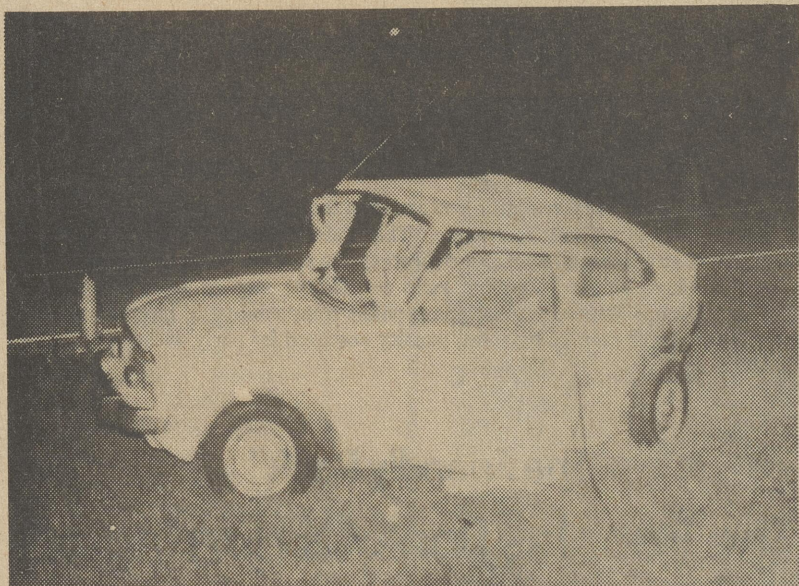

but it was always exciting to find it hiding under the leaves or peeping through the trees.

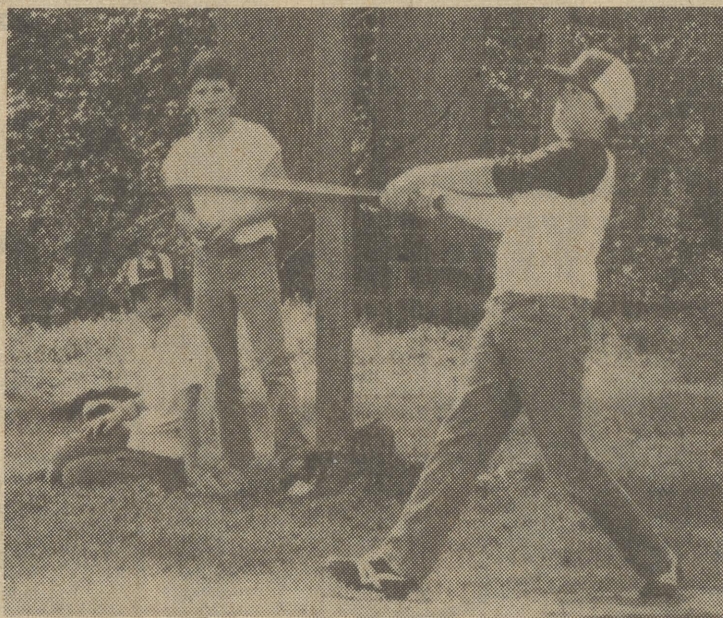
The reptile house seemed to be the favorite of most of the students, but the bird house was especially nice because one section was set up so that the children could walk into the enclosure with the animals.

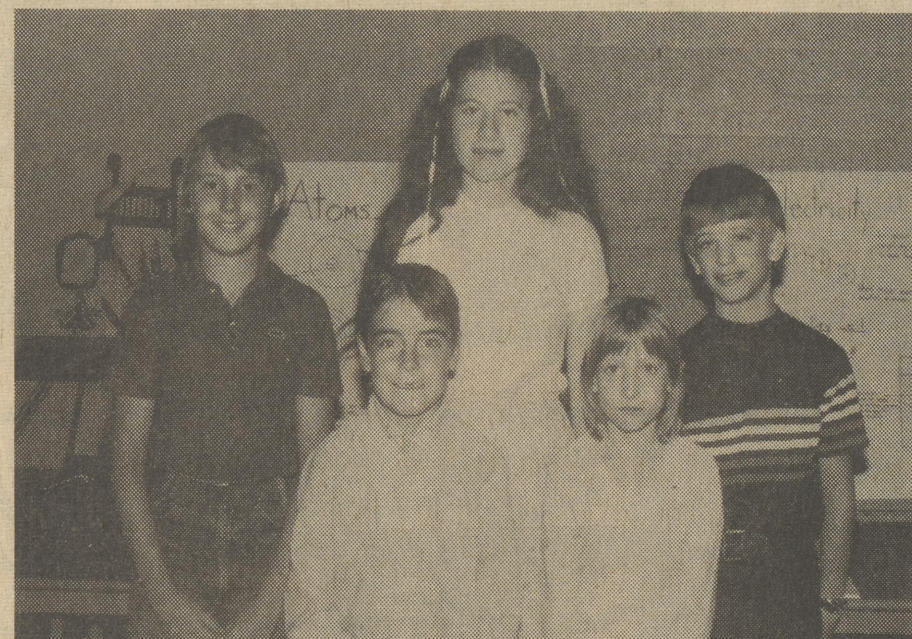
