James Armstrong resigned last week as a bishop of the United Methodist Church and as president of the Na tional Council of Churches. <br> "Serious personal problems which have created a severe family crisis," was the reason given by James Steele, the bishop's press spokesman. The resignation was delivered here during the first day of the Council of Bishops' fall meeting by a member of Bishop fall meeting by a member of Bishop was the resident bishop. The resignation stunned the assembled group of bishops, none of whom appeared to know in advance that it was under consideration. <br> Dr. Armstrong is among the church's best known and most controversial leaders.
