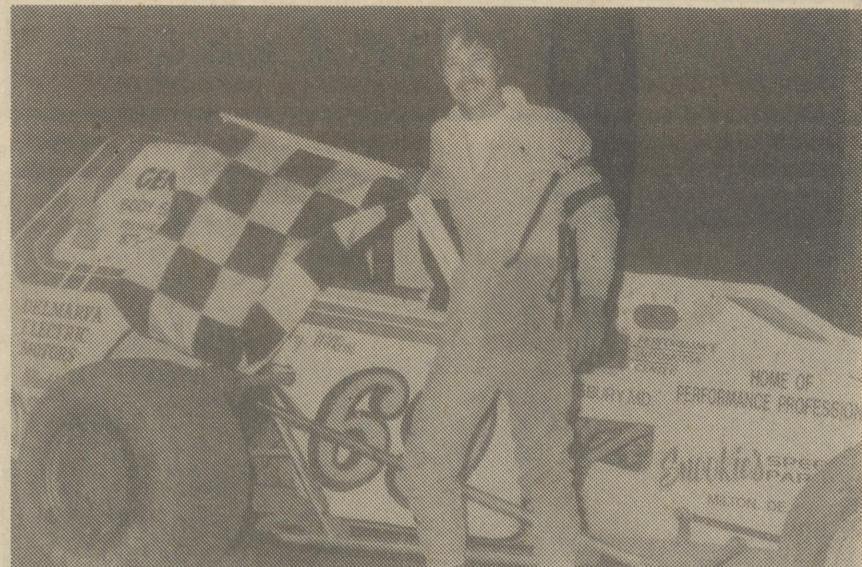

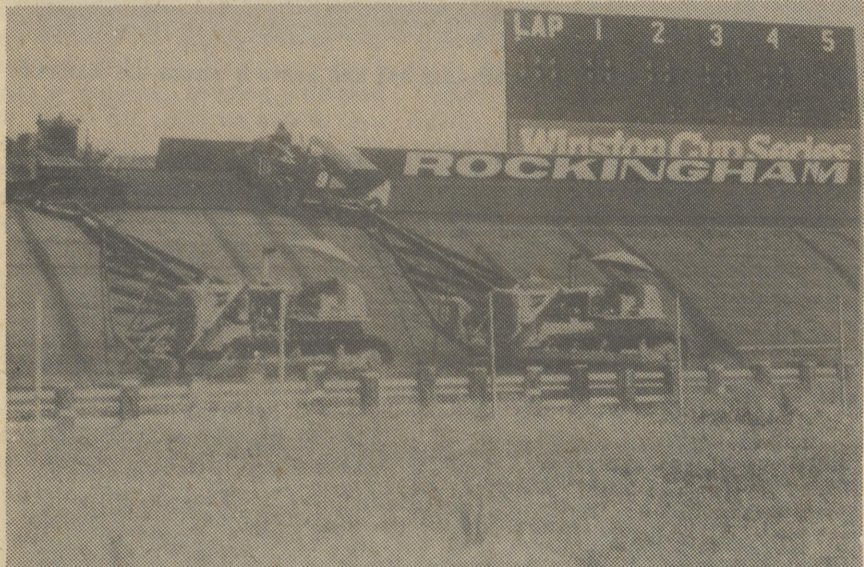

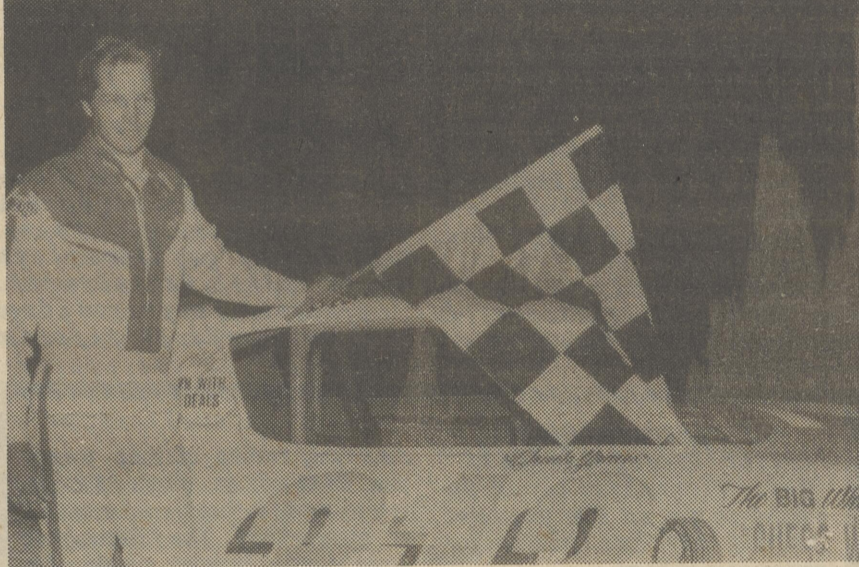

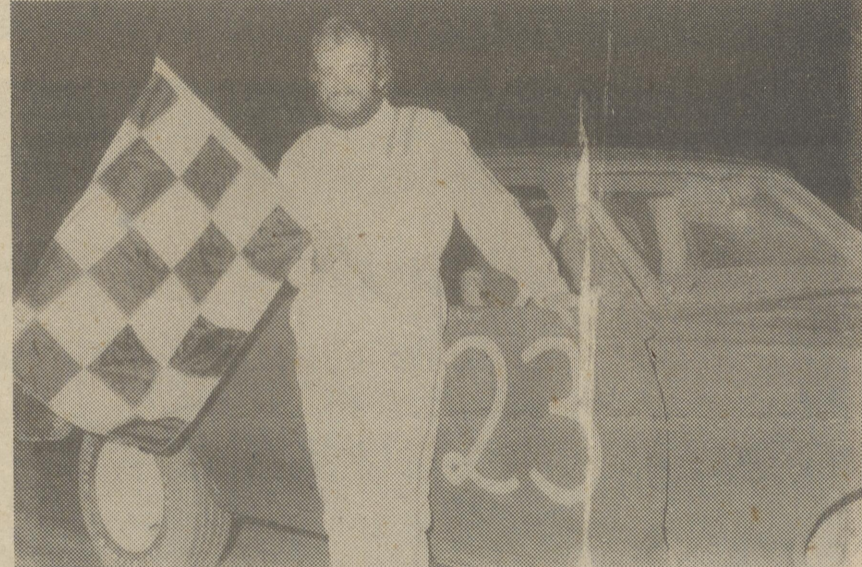

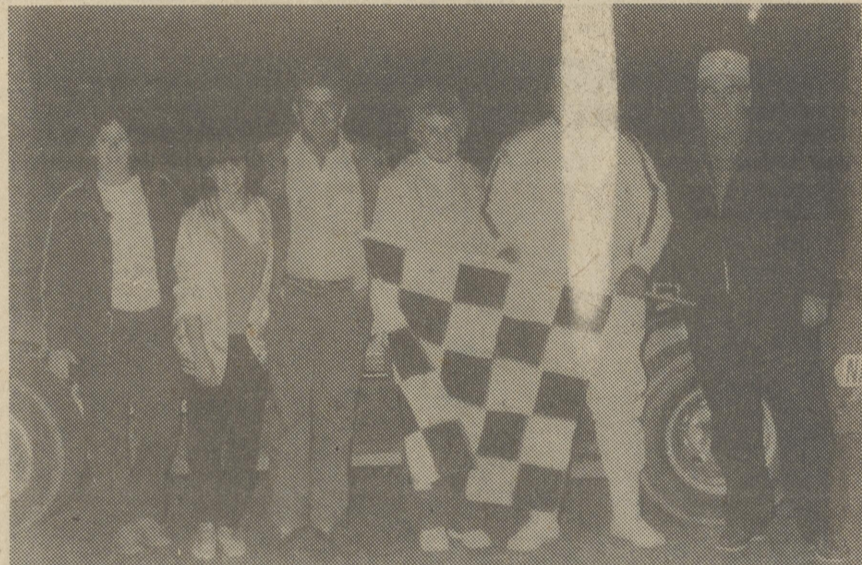
## Points battle heats up as June racing specials continue at Bridgeport

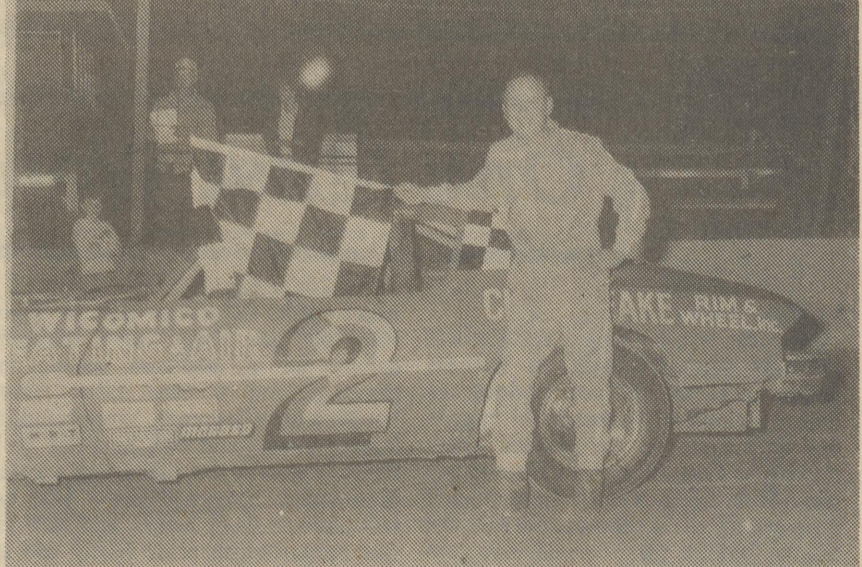

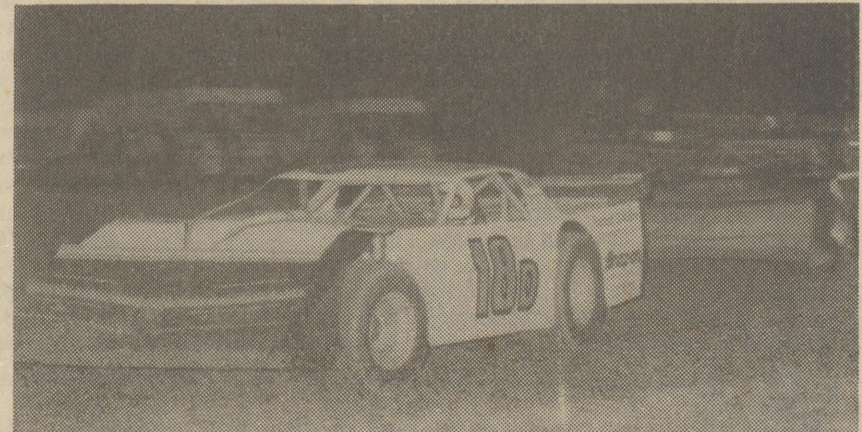
