## Harrington loses to Milford 7-4

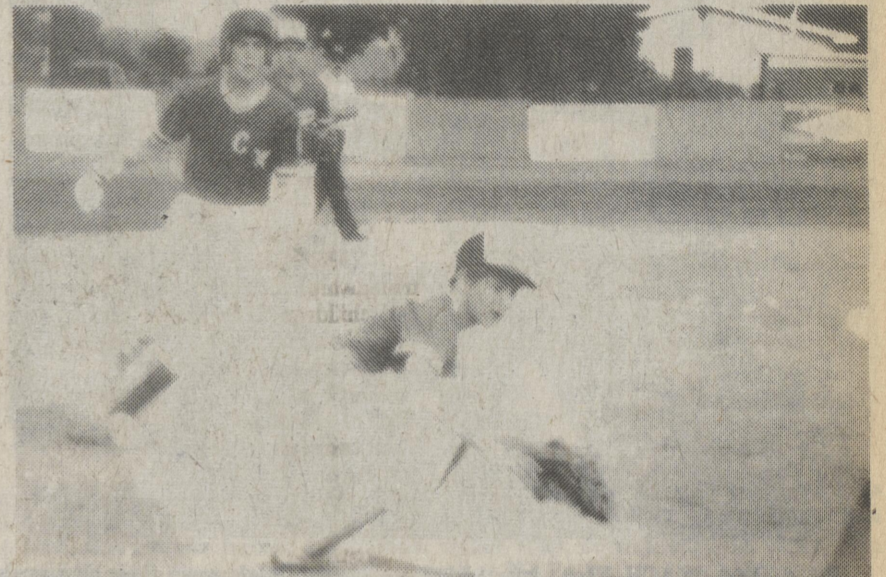

### Too Little Too Late or A Start In The Right Direction

Governor Mike Castle recently signed a harness racing bill that was sponsored by Representative G. Robert (Bobby) Quillen, of Harrington that may help horsemen see larger purse monies in Delaware. In a recent issue of "Harness Horse" magazine this report was filed from New York State. Tax relief for Roosevelt and Yonkers Raceways was one of the key measures of an omnibus racing bill passed by the New York State Senate and Assembly on Sunday, June 30, during the final hours of the legislative session. The bill, which awaits Gov. Mario Cuomo's signature, provides for tax relief of approximately \$6.4 million for Yonkers and \$4.2 million for Roosevelt, with a provision that the money be earmarked for purses. Both of these bills are landmarks, that can only help the sport, I hope it's not too little, too late.

## In The Pocket

It's not uncommon for people to travel some distance to work. Rick Murphy of Felton, DE drives over an hour to work six days a week, and that's not unusual except for the fact that once he arrives Murphy has to drive again. The 25 year old Delawarean drives harness horses for a living, and these trips he makes at Ocean Downs nightly only last about two minutes. "I love it here," says Murphy and with good reason as he is currently one of the leading drivers at the Ocean oval, with 118 starts and over \$17,000 earned in total purse money. Murphy has grown up with harness racing as his father Lewis once drove and now only trains horses. Both father and son train pacers and trotters at the Paradise Alley Farm in Delaware. The day is a long one for the Murphy's as they start working with their horses at 7:30 a.m., leave for Ocean Downs about 5 p.m. and wrap up their activity here about midnight and head home to start over again the next day. Rick Murphy also drives in to the raceway on Wednesday and Saturday mornings to drive in qualifying races. Rick Murphy says, "It's just luck," when speaking about himself and where he currently stands in the driver rankings at Ocean Downs. Skill and quick thinking are also involved and Murphy plans on

taking all the skills and hopefully some of his "ocean luck" at Dover Downs in the fall. For now the winning driver can be seen Tuesday through Sunday night's at Ocean Downs driving in three or more races a night. Ocean Downs continues its "big meet of '85" tonight with post-time set for 8 p.m., rain or shine. On The Road Again went wire to wire in a track record equaling time of 1:55 2/5 on Saturday to win the \$145,000 Levy Memorial Pace at Roosevelt Raceway. Winning the race by 6 3/4 lengths, bringing his lifetime earnings to \$2.2 million. Buddy Gilmore was at his usual place sitting behind this super tough colt. Ridgewood Express won at Ocean Downs in a \$5,000 pace in 1:58.1 on Saturday with Marathon finishing second and Valiant Bid getting the show spot. Maybe the Meadowlands Pace should be called the Lou Guida Pace this year, he will have a five horse entry this year, racing for \$1 million dollars later this week. Lou Guida, who has put together some of the largest and most expensive syndicates in harness racing history, lives in Yardley, PA,

works for Merrill-Lynch and spends most of his time forming groups of horse buyers, into syndicates, will have two of the top rated three year olds in the nation in the race. Nihilator and Pershing Square both won their qualifiers in 1:52/3, with Marauder winning his in 1:53 flat. The remaining horses for the race are: Chairman of the Board, Handsome Sum, Primus, Forrest Skipper, Witsend Skipper, Anxious Robby, Pinocchio, New Bret, Dignatarian. This could be a very fast race this year. Compiled by Mike Hariker. 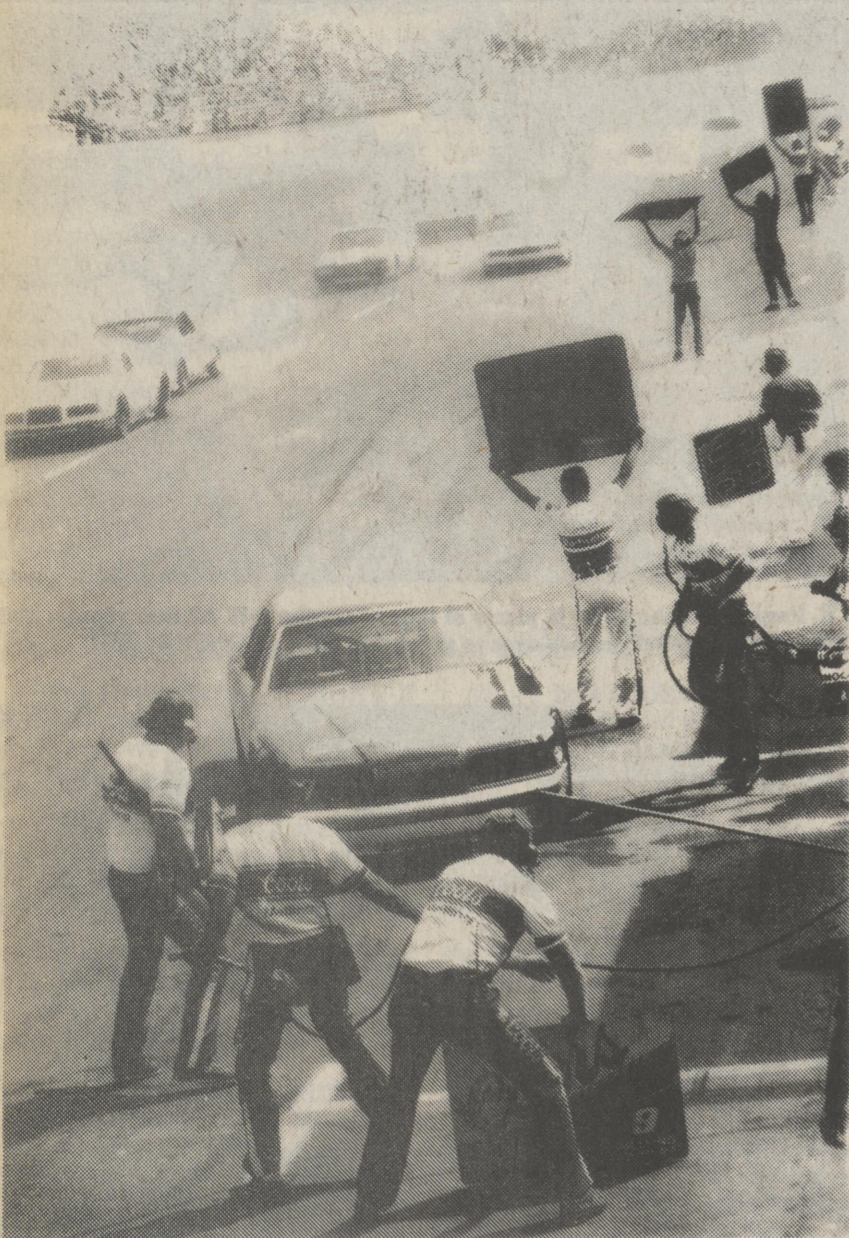

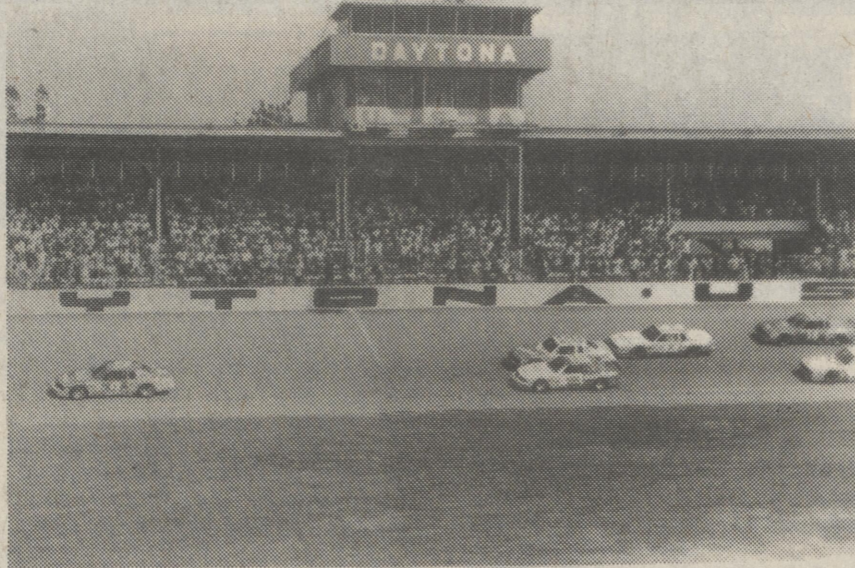

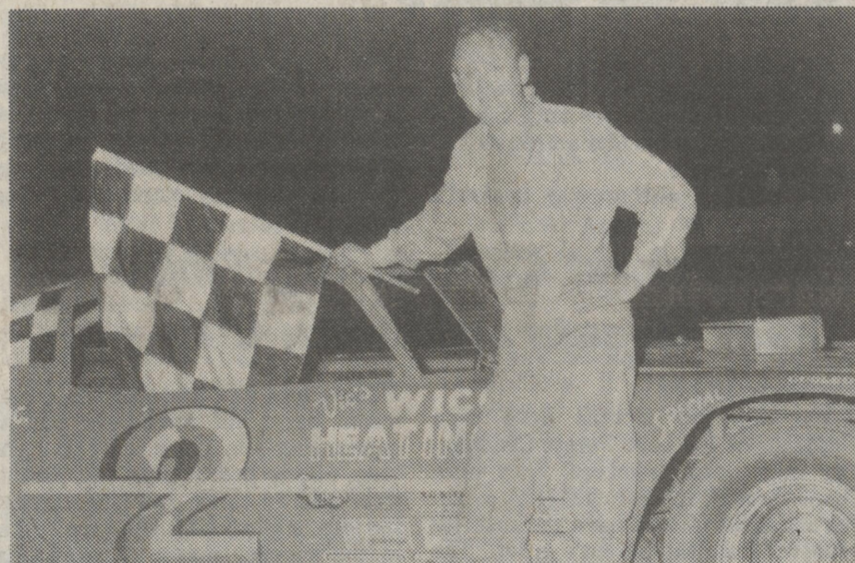
## Georgetown Speedway has action packed show

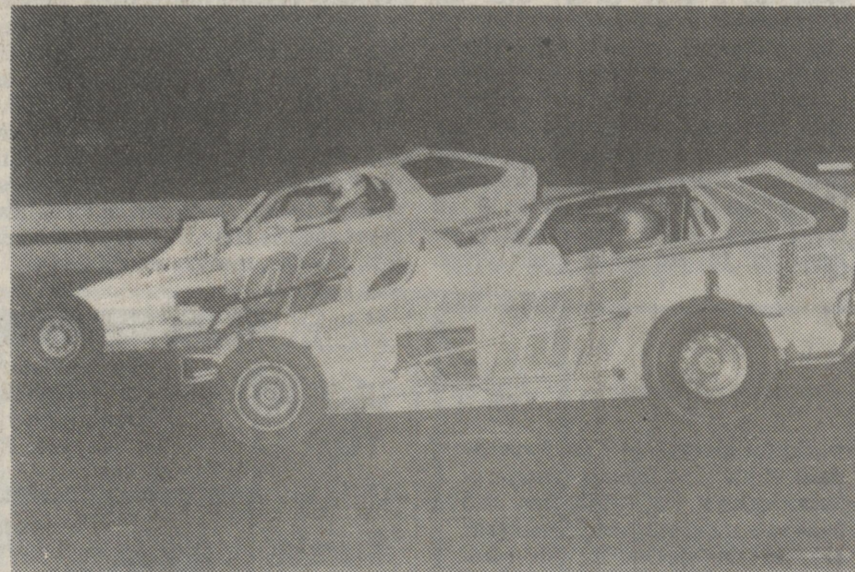

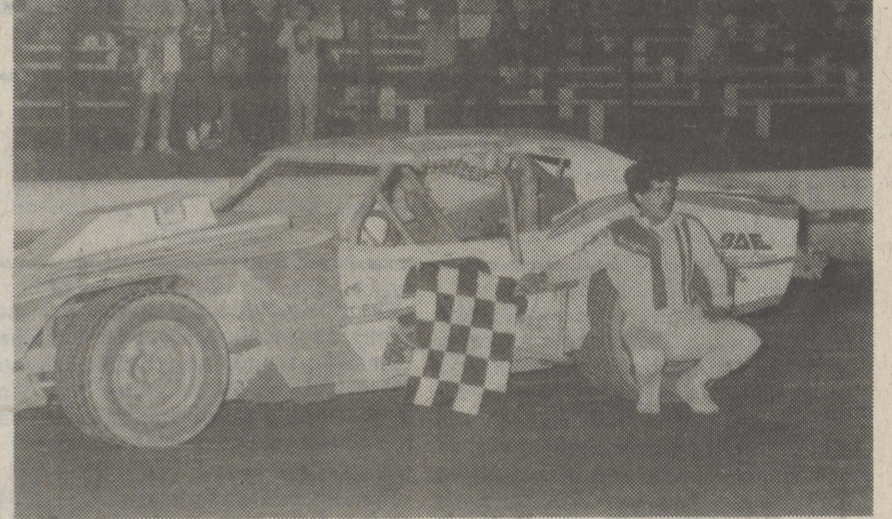

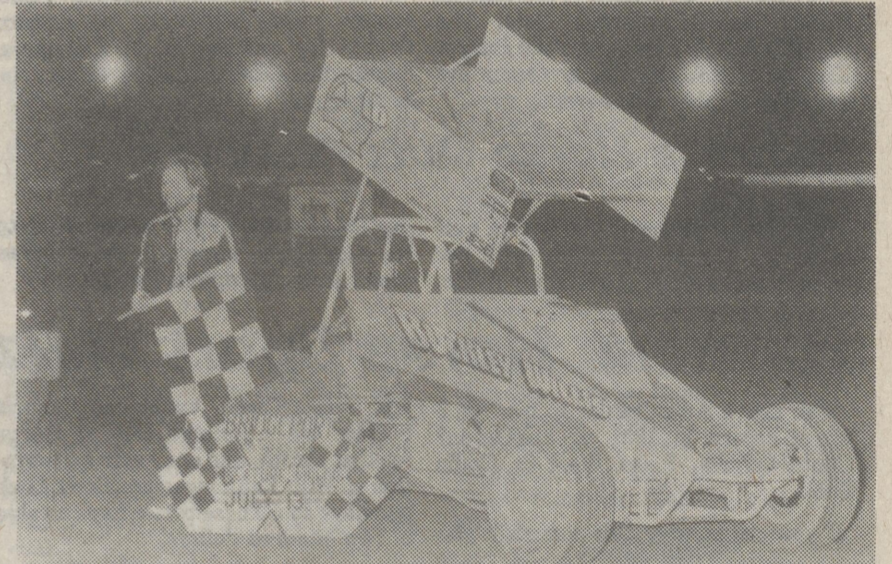

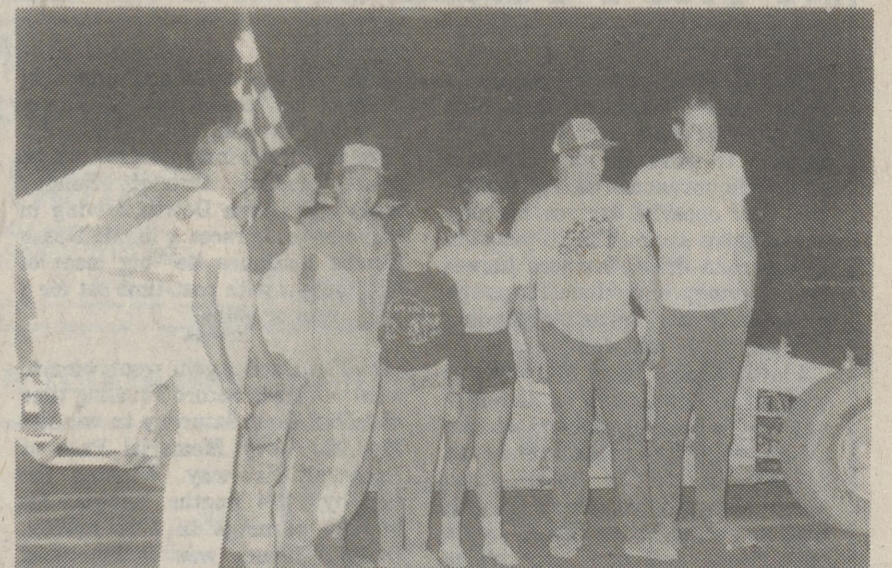

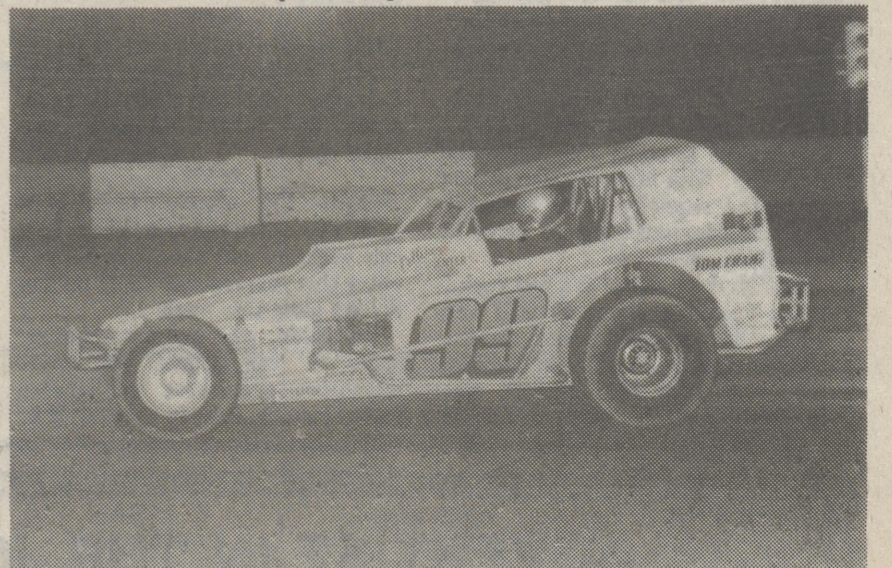
East Windsor New Jersey 07-12-85 - 2B - J. Buffalo won late model feature. Photo by Joe Simpkins

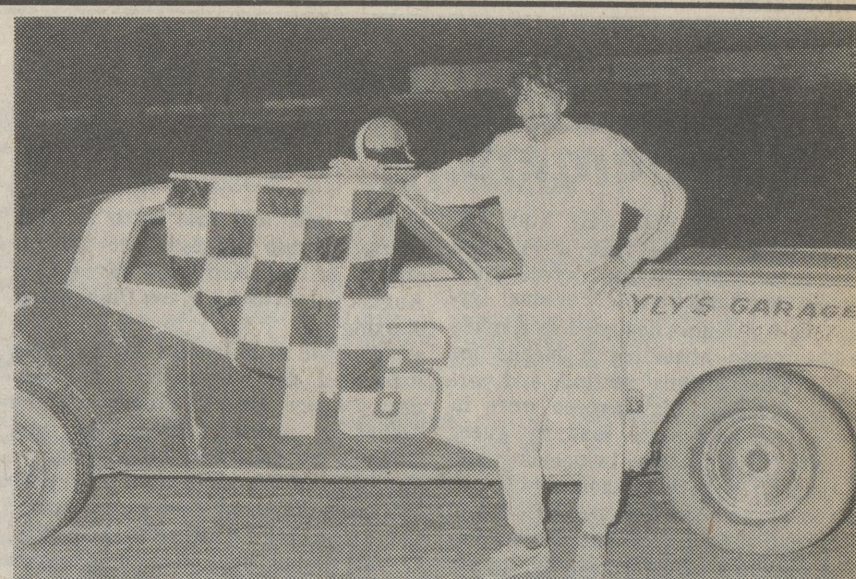




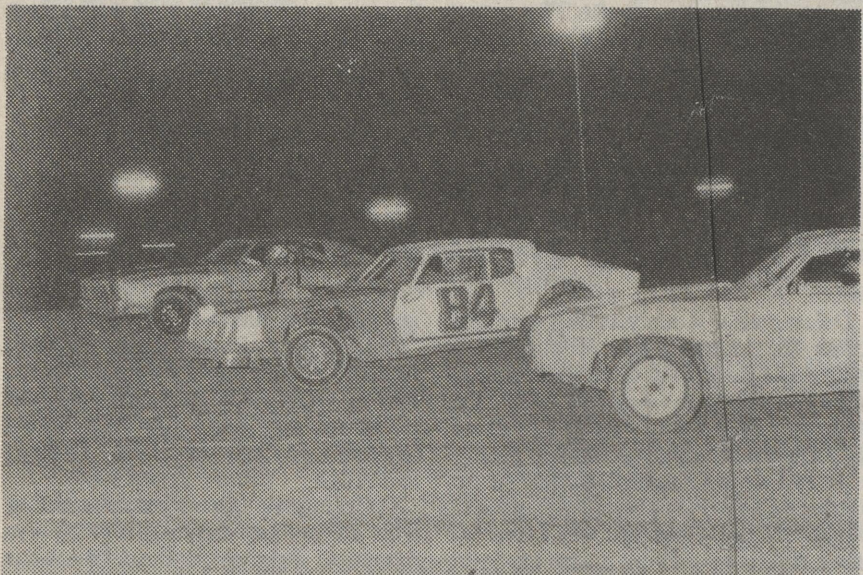

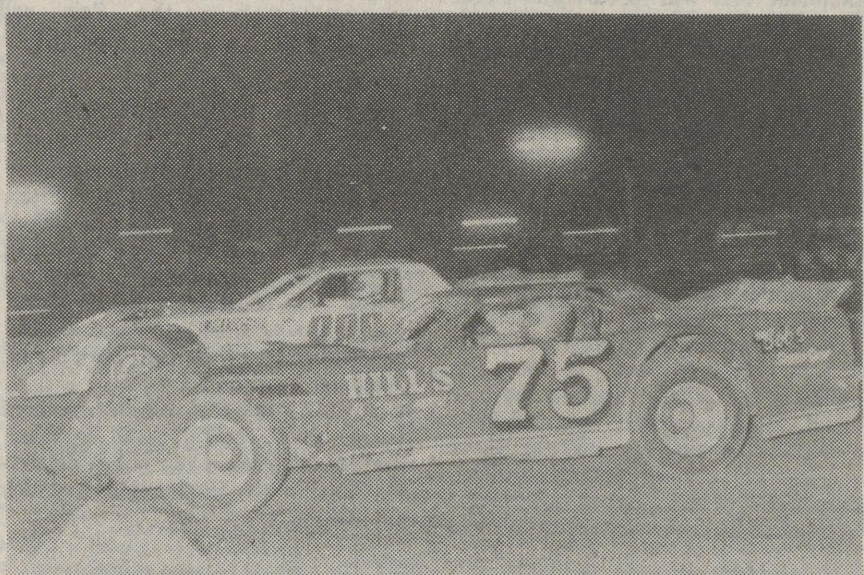
