Lake Forest voters face tough referendum choice

The voters of the Lake Forest School District will be called to the election polls this Saturday for a two part referendum vote.

The first question will test whether the District as landlord should vote in favor of a \$4.1 million renovation and expansion plan for the School District. This would involve a major capital improvement program for all five of the schools within the District. The central improvement would be the repairing of all roofs in the district, and at East only, it would mean the construction of additional classrooms.

Another major concern of some taxpayers is that under this renovation plan, South "B" would become in part the new home of the administrative offices for the District, an Instructional Resource Center, a Pre-School Diagnostic Center and space for central warehousing. For South "B" the cost would be \$304,000.

The \$4.1 million would require the

\$20 per person. The cost of the program would be divided between the State and the local District on a percentage of 60% and 40% respectively.

The second question to be considered is a proposal of raising the taxes fourteen cents per \$100 of assessed value to enable the teachers of the Lake Forest School District to benefits from the State Equalization Formula. This would give the District approximately \$245,000. Of this figure 75% would be used solely for teacher salaries. The other 25% would be used to provide salary increases to other employees like cafeteria workers, janitors and administrators as well as for the purchase of instructional supplies, materials and equipment.



them saying he had paid the last time. It was not clear from Baker's testimony that he mentioned by names the troopers. The officers at the lanes testified Baker said he had given the money to Mollohan and Porter....or Porter and Mollohan. The order was not remembered.



He was unable to place Baker or his place of residence. Porter had asked Spillan for the opportunity to meet Baker. Later when Porter met Baker, he still could not place him.











The two girls who joined the aforementioned top trio and solidified this team were Dixon and Lake. We'd had good reports on these girls who ran well for Baxter Smith at Chipman. But this time the duo was being asked to run 3 plus miles. Lots of male Lake Forest students don't want to run that far and these were members of the feminine gender and young ones at that. Neither had run further than 11/2 miles. Dixon, a freshman, is a versatile athlete who could play well in other sports. She was a steady No. 4 Spartan all season. It was a real treat to see the tall, lithe freshman accelerate quickly and blow by three rivals in the homestretch at Bellevue, which is on a duPont family horse-racing oval.

Lake was at a disadvantage this season because she did not run last year as a freshman. This loss of momentum had to hamper her somewhat, but she was a solid No. 5 Spartan finisher with some finishes higher than that. But Coach Blades knew Lorraine could run because of her fine clockings at Chipman.

Earlier the Spartans and Bucs had finished 2-3 to Caesar Rodney in a torrid, three-way fight for the Kent County title, in a race run at Caesar Rodney. A Spartan runner there was injured, costing Lake Forest a possible

Mark Tozer, as usual, did his job. The 15-year-old sophomore sensation. completed a perfect season against Kent and Sussex foes, by running the rugged 3.1 miles course in 17.07, a new personal mark, Ray Powell did not have a good outing and finished 14th behind several runners he had beaten before. Mike Mosley, a senior, has improved steadily all season. Mike was 17th with a NPR of 18.39. None of the remaining Spartans ran as well as they have done here-tofor, although at least one of them was

It looks as if another year will pass without any horse breaking Victory

Victory Hy paced into racing's record books back in 1950 when he won 65

Hothead will have to go on a hot streak if he's to challenge Victory Hy. The 3year-old pacer leads all North American performers with 27 wins in 30 starts. Among trotters, Hopeful Action, a 2year-old, and Arzew, a 3-year-old both have visited the winner's circle on 21 occasions.

Of course, to win 65 races you have to start at least 65 times. That requirement alone keeps Victory Hy's record safe, but now and then an "iron man" comes along...or maybe an "iron lady" such as Pinedale Cheryl.

This extraordinary miss has made 60 trips postward this year (with 18 wins). 58 of them at Champlain Park in Dieppe, New Brunswick, Canada. This amazing spinster, now 11, did not set foot on a racetrack until the age of five. but made up for that lost time by racing a total of 271 times over the last seven seasons. For all her effort, Pinedale Cheryl has earned only \$28,171. By comparison, this year's sensation, Nihilator has won \$81,989 per start in his career. If Pinedale Cheryl had the advantage of making 271 starts for the 'big money", she'd have banked \$22,219,019!

On The Road Again, winner of the \$250,000 final of the Yonkers Fall Championship Series, has moved to the top of the all-time money winning list. 'Road's" \$125,000 winner's share boosted his bankroll to \$2,765,352 -\$12,686 better than the previous leader, Ideal Du Gazeau. The latter amassed most of earnings in Europe over a seven year career that saw him make only occasional forays into North America.

On The Road Again, in his third year at the races, has won 42 times - 22 of them this year Last season, his earnings \$1,751,056 made him the most prolific single-season money-winner in harness racing history. He has also

become the second harness horse to earn more than \$1 million in each of two seasons (Nihilator being the other).

The money record, however, may fall to Nihilator before both horses retire at the end of this year. Nihilator still has several rich events left on his schedule, including the \$600,000 (est.) Breeders Crown on November 29 - an event in which he will be heavily favored.

Bill O'Donnell stands poised to break his own single-season money record for a driver. The native of Nova Scotia is hovering right at the \$9 million figure, according to official U.S.T.A. statistics, and he should eclipse his record of

Actually, despite the lateness of the season and the paucity of major stakes races, O'Donnell has a shot at becoming harness racing's first \$10 Million Dollar Man. There are three Breeders Crown events left this year, and O'Donnell is the regular driver for the three favorites Barberry Spur in the two-year-old colt pace at Rosecroft this week, Armbro Devona in the three-year-old filly trot at Pompano next week, and Nihilator in the three-year-old colt pacer at Garden State on November 22. Victories in those events, plus a smattering of money from overnight contests, could put O'Donnell at the

eight-figure level. O'Donnell's only challenger in the driver earnings stratosphere, John Campbell, has driven horses earning over \$8.5 million this year. No other driver in history has earned \$5 million in a single year, though Mike Lachance is likely to hit that figure before 1985 is

Campbell's forte this year has been Breeders Crown competition. John has three wins and one second in but six starts, with his earnings in Breeders Crown racing alone \$876.842 — for 11 minutes and 47 seconds of work! That translates to \$74,435 a minute, give or take a few pennies, in Breeders Crown

Tozer falls but is 6th in State meet

Lake Forest had hoped to get second place in individual competition and in team competition at Saturday's Delaware State Cross-Country Championship Run in the boys division.

The run was held at Bellevue State Park, a former DuPont family country estate. "Those rich folks really knew how to live." And in the race, the rich got richer as Dickinson High won the Group II race as expected and Tom Byers of Dickinson repeated as state champ also, as expected.

Lake Forest's hopes for the runnerup team finish were dashed before the race as the Spartans were missing two runners. As Robbie Burns once noted, "The best laid plans of mice and men gang aft agley," or in other words, don't always come to fruition. The pressure then shifted to Mark Tozer. Barely 15-year-old, the spartan sophomore is one of the top peninsula runners.

He had been sixth in the Lake Forest Invitational, against runners from four states. Second to the Maryland State Champion in the Salisbury Invitational, third in Washington, D.C.'s Spingarn Invitational, fifth in the Salesianum Invitatinal and was unbeaten, downstate. In probably Mark's toughest start at the Salesianum Invitational, he closed fast to miss Dickinson senior, Don Casner by only three seconds for fourth place.

At Bellevue Mark was aiming to shadow Casner or Archmere's Tom Carey, whichever one of the two who happened to be in second place behind the flying superstar Dave Byers. At one and a half miles halfway through the race, Tozer and Casner were dead-even for second place. Rounding a turn with Tozer on the inside, Casner slanted in toward the Spartan and got a little closer than he should have. Trying to avoid the collision, Mark fell heavily and lost his golden opportunity for second place. Such a fall hurts a runner in several ways and Mark eventually struggled home in 67th place behind a Milford runner who Mark had beaten seven times this season.

With Mark Tozer out of the way,

Casner was not challenged for second, finishing 12 seconds ahead of Carey. It seems realistic that the Spartan would have been second or third without the fall. The disappointed Spartan star to his credit, refused to blame Casner. Mark stated "I am not sure that Casner cut me off deliberately, and I don't know whether he even saw me fall."

Those are the statements of a gentleman and a true sport. We at Lake Forest have us a real winner. it says here.

Other Spartans to run well were: Mike Mosley, whose season-long improvement ended with a No. 2 finish on the team in this valuable senior's last race. Mike didn't have the superb, natural talent some of his teammates have had, but he is intelligent, loyal and hard-working and gave the sport all he had over the last few years.

Bill Haggerty was three seconds back and ran a great race in his final cross-country start here. He's also a senior. Bill was a star harrier at Chipman School but missed a couple of seasons at Lake Forest for different reasons, thus he didn't do as well as he would have liked. But he was No. 3 in his swan song and he has been an important cog, as Lake Forest had a fine year, after losing

four key men from last autumn. Scott Torgeson, a sophomore, was only two seconds behind Haggerty. Torgeson was hampered in 1984 by leg problems, but rebounded to turn in some solid performances, this year, including this one. Unfortunately, Scott and his twin brother, Shawn, another good prospect are moving into the Caesar Rodney district while Cape Henlopen, Seaford and Milford, all picked up transfer student talent this year, Lake Forest is seeing two go the other way. This clears the way, of course, for other Lake Forest students to try the sport next season.

Lake Forest finished fifth in the thirteen team race at full strength, the locals would have been third in all probability after losing Mike Melvin, Dan Haines, Kevin Pelton and Mark Whidden by graduation in June. We'd have to say the Spartans have done very well this autumn.





Delaware Energy Assistance Program launched to help needy Delaware families stay warm

Help is available for people who have trouble paying their energy bills. The Delaware Energy Assistance Program (DEAP) will begin accepting fuel assistance applications from lowincome families on November 4, 1985. About \$6,000,000 will be given to needy families in Delaware this year. The monies will be used for fuel

furnace repairs, emergency housing, and energy education and counseling. The projected funds are expected to help about \$14,000 households this winter with an average fuel assistance

assistance supplements, weatheriza-

tion, oil furnace tune-ups, minor

benefit of \$355.00. Last year, DEAP helped people use energy wisely by providing weatherization services at no cost to eligible households. These services included: adding attic insulation, installing storm windows and door sweeps, caulking and weatherstripping around doors and windows, and replacing broken window panes. Services such as the installation of skirting and storm panels were offered to eligible mobile home residents.

Eligibility requirements for the DEAP are based on the number of persons in a household. The maximum income for a family of four is \$13,313. For each additional family member, add \$2,250. Applicants should contact the following offices in their counties to make an appointment.

behind Bill and still win the Winston Cup title.'

Entering the 1985 season finale, the Winston Western 500 at Riverside, Calif., on Nov. 17, Waltrip has earned 4,141 points compared to 4,121 for Elliott in their duel for the national driving championship and \$250,000

from Winston cigarettes. Waltrip knows that if he finishes second or third and leads at least one lap - worth a five-point bonus - he will win the title regardless of how Elliott finishes in the Winston Western 500. "I have got to race and keep Bill in

sight," says the driver of the Budweiser-Kentucky Fried Chicken Chevrolet Monte Carlo. "I can't just take it easy. But the pressure is on Bill. He has to go

Elliott says his game plan will be quite simple, "win the race and lead the most laps (worth a five-point bonus)."

"If we do that, we've got a real g shot at wining the Winston Cup championship. Don't count me out." Continuing, the Ford driver said, "Darrell has to run good. He can't be too conservative and a lot of things can happen at Riverside.'

This is the seventh straight year that the battle for the championship has gone down to the last race of the season, and Waltrip has been in five of the racing wars.

"This is what the season is all about, trying to win the championship," says Waltrip. "I like coming to the last race with the title still on the line. I like being in the heat of the battle. I didn't like going to Riverside last year and not being a factor in the race for the title. I was determined that wasn't going to be the case this year."

Waltrip is two and two in his drive to equal Richard Petty's unprecedented

seven Winston Cup titles. He lost to Petty in 1979 and to Bobby Allison in 1983 and beat Allison in 1981 and 1982. This year's title chase is the second closest in NASCAR history, and

Waltrip was involved in the tightest

point battle in the sport's history -

1979 with Petty.

Waltrip entered the final race of the '79 season with a two-point lead and lost the title to Petty by 11 points. That is the only time in the last six years that the driver with the point lead entering the season finale has lost the championship.

If the two drivers end the season tied, the driver with the most wins - Elliott - will win the Winston Cup title.

Both Waltrip and Elliott are glad the championship is being determined on a road course, since both drivers consider themselves good road racers.

Comments by the two about the 2.62mile, nine-turn track are identical. "Riverside has been good to me. I like road racing. It's a challenge. The driver has a lot more say in how you run."

Waltrip has won four races at the only road course now on the Winston Cup schedule and eight pole positions, more than any other driver. He has won seven of the last 10 pole positions at Riverside with Terry Labonte winning the other

Elliott scored his first Winston Cup victory at Riverside in the 1983 Winston Western 500, and the driver of the Coors-Melling Thunderbird has not finished out the top 10 in his last five

starts at the California track. Qualifying for the Winston Western 500 begins at 4:30 p.m. (EST) on Friday, November 15, with Waltrip and Labonte rated as the co-favorites in the battle for the No. 1 starting position.

"Qualifying will be important." says Waltrip. "If I can win the pole, I can lead that first lap and get those five points. That will put even more pressure on Bill.'

Every driver who leads at least one of the 119 laps will earn a five-point bonus, and the driver who leads the most laps will receive another fivepoint bonus.

The 500 will get the green flag at 2:15 p.m. (EST), on Sunday, November 17, and the Winston Cup season finale will be televised live by WTBS.

one of which was Porter. Baker was unable to identify Porter in the photo. Porter also volunteered to take a lie detector test. Porter was confident of his innocence and was not surprised when he was told he passed. Spillan then asked Porter if he would take a second test with a different examiner after Mr. Baker passed his lie detector. Porter agreed, and the second examiner interpreted that certain answers to him were deceptive. The same examiner was asked to review the first test which again the examiner viewed as deceptive. The questions relating directly to accepting the \$5.00 showed no deception; only the questions relating to Porter's knowledge of the someone taking the \$5.00 showed deception.

Some people react differently to these types of tests. The polygraph examiner was asked if after being told he had passed the first test, and then asked to take a second test, would there be any pressure on the person and consequently cause him to fail the second lie detector test. The expert examiner replied that it was possible.

Porter later submitted to sodium amatol (truth serum) which proved that he had no knowledge of the matter.

When Baker took the stand at State Police Headquarters, the only thing he was positive of was that he had given someone \$5.00. His testimony on the dates of the incident was conflicting as was the identity of the alleged troopers. Baker said he "laid a \$5.00 bill....it was the last one I had in my pocket....on the fender of the car," but he agreed that he

did not see anyone pick it up. In 1981 there was a \$5.00 fee for clearing titles to vehicles. The fee was paid to Motor Vehicle. This has always been the practice. The \$5.00 fee that Baker paid according to his ex-wife was

in 1983 when he had a Pinto inspected. His wife said he paid the fee then.

If Baker asked in 1981 if there was a charge for the service, he would have gotten an answer of "Yes, \$5.00." If he in fact took \$5.00 out of his pocket....which he testified was his last \$5.00...and placed it on the car's fender which he testified, it was not conclusive that anyone in fact picked it up. Since Baker did not see anyone take the money, it was presumed to have been

During his testimony, Baker sat within 10 feet of Sgt. Porter. Defense attorney James Liguori asked Baker if he could identify the defendant "....the man sitting right there. Who is he?" asked Liguori. Baker could not identify him as Sgt. William Porter of the Delaware State Police.

At the close of the prosecution's case, the defense brought two witnesses in who testified that Baker had told them in 1983 that he had paid a Delaware State Trooper \$5.00 for an inspection of a 1973 Pinto...at Baker's residence. Sgt. Mollohan testified that he had inspected a 1973 Pinto for Baker at his residence in 1983 but denied accepting the \$5.00 gratuity.

The trial began at 9:00 a.m. on Friday morning and terminated with the "not guilty" verdict of Porter at midnight. The trial board headed by Major Clifford M. Graviet, Capt. Terry Inman and Capt. James Corrigan rendered a unanimous verdict of "not guilty". Porter's defense was buoyed by an extensive and careful investigation of Private Detective Terry Schneible of the

This was the first time in the history of the Delaware State Police that a trial hearing was held in the open according to the "Sunshine Laws" of the State of Delaware, and also a case protected by the "Policeman Bill of Rights" as drafted by State Senator Ruth Ann Minner. Porter elected under his rights to have the hearing open to the public, "...because I had nothing to hide."

Short Takes on Area News Fire death in Hartly

A joint fire-death investigation is being conducted by the State Fire Marshal's office and Delaware State Police, Troop 3, Woodside. The Hartly Fire Company responded to a fire at 3:48 a.m. last Thursday at the J & W Market, located on Delaware Rt. 11, north of Delaware Rt. 44 in Hartly.

Heavy smoke and fire were coming from the one and one-half story frame building when the fire company arrived. The fire company personnel made several unsuccessful efforts to get the trapped person out.

Upon extinguishing the blaze some ten minutes later, the body of Joseph S. Waite, 41, Dover, was removed from the building and transported to Kent General Hospital by the Hartly ambulance where he was pronounced dead on arrival at 8:00 a.m. The body was turned over the State Medical Examiner for determination of cause of death.

Also injured was Eleanor F. Waite, 41, of Dover, who has been admitted to Kent General Hospital for back injuries which resulted when she jumped from the building during the fire.

The building which had a small living area in the attic, was heavily damaged as a result of the fire. It is owned by Roger E. Davis of Hartly.

The Fire Marshal's office is investigating to determine the origin of the fire.
